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Welcome back from Mr Marande



Welcome to the new school year!

I'm delighted to introduce the first Team TPS Weekly of the new school year and I would like to extend a special welcome to our new Year 7 parents joining us this week for the first time.

Last month, we celebrated record breaking GCSE success with the Class of 2025. Students once again made outstanding progress, with nearly 85% achieving a grade 4 (grade C) or above in both English and maths, the highest achievement in the history of the school! Additionally, over a third of all the grades awarded at TPS this year were at the top grade 7 to 9 (A/A*/A**) level. The cohort achieved these remarkable results, whilst demonstrating great resilience, commitment and determination during their time at the school, starting in the lockdown period.

The accomplishments of students were celebrated across the board. Particular highlights include:

Eve B, our outgoing Head Girl from Westbourne, achieved a staggering ELEVEN straight grade 9 GCSEs (A**)! This is something that less than 150 students across the whole country achieve each year (out of well over half a million students taking GCSEs!). Eve said, "I am so pleased with my results! I have had such an amazing time at TPS. I am now going to study biology, chemistry, maths and sociology". Eve has now started at our joint Bohunt Sixth Form in Liphook and plans to later study medicine at Bristol University.

Immy S, from Horndean, achieved one grade 9, five grade 8 (A*) and two grade 7 (A) GCSEs. We are especially proud of Immy's achievements and determination considering her significant personal challenges, with her father very sadly passing away from MND during the exam period. Immy said, "I didn't think I was going to do as well as I have done and have really appreciated all the help and support of everyone at TPS. I am looking forward to studying business at college."

Several subjects secured truly remarkable results with over 85% of the students achieving grades 4 to 9 (A* to C) including English, maths, biology, chemistry, physics, geography, drama, dance, music, art, sociology, media and Mandarin.

We are all exceptionally proud of our students and how hard they have worked at TPS to achieve such amazing, record breaking GCSE results. I would like to thank all our students, their families, our staff and the wider school community for their ongoing support for Team TPS. We cannot wait to see the great things that our students will go on to accomplish in the next stage of their education and in the wider world.

SMARTPHONE FREE TPS

Student and Parent Guide

- No phones to be used or seen on site at TPS until after the last bell of the day
- This applies from the moment students walk through the school gates in the morning
- Smartphones/smartwatches are classified as 'prohibited items'

LOWER SCHOOL - Year 7 & 8

- No Smartphones allowed on site at any time
- 'Brick phones' to be switched off and stored in bags/lockers while in school

UPPER SCHOOL - Year 9, 10 & 11

- Any smartphones/'brick phones' to be placed into the secure, padded phone collection box during tutor time.
- Phones safely locked away for collection at the end of the school day.

If a smartphone is seen or found on a student:

- Phone confiscated until the end of the week (regardless of the day it is taken) and kept securely locked away in Student Services
- One hour SLT detention issued for Friday after school and student can collect their phone at the end of this detention
- A second incident will lead to parents needing to collect the phone after an extend period of confiscation

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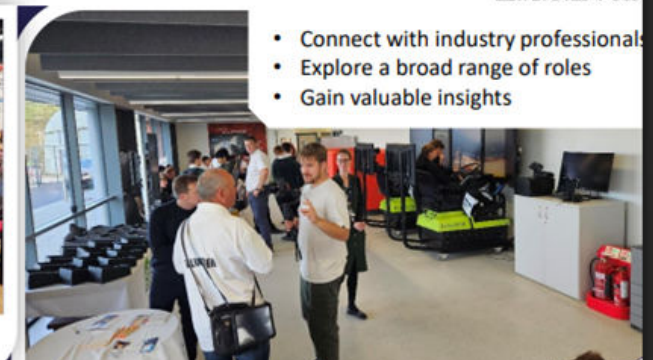

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about SOCIAL MEDIA & MENTAL HEALTH

An estimated one-third of children have a social media account, so it's important that trusted adults know what content young people are consuming, what they're posting and the interactions they're having. On social media, it can be easy to go down 'rabbit holes' that aren't beneficial to our wellbeing. As platforms grapple with managing such 'legal but harmful' content, lives are being impacted – sometimes to tragic effect. We might be daunted by the scale of the tech giants and their content which so entrains young people, but we can still help children to be aware of their mental wellness: recognising when something isn't OK... and knowing what to do about content that upsets them.

1. UNDERSTAND THE ALGORITHM

Algorithms rank content by user interest: someone who regularly interacts with sports news, say, will see the latest results at the top of their feed. Likewise, if a user browses content that can cause harm, that's what will be recommended to them in future. Someone who's had a bad day and looks for posts which reflect their mood will find similar content being suggested to them more and more.

2. AVOID THE MAIN FEEDS

Avoiding the default feeds on social media platforms limits the amount of recommended content that's shown. Users can opt to only scroll through the accounts they follow, use restricted modes, or highlight posts that they don't want to see more of. Explore the platform safety settings to see how you can take control of what your child's phone shows them when they open the app.

3. DISCUSS WHAT THEY'VE SEEN

Chatting about what your child's seen online keeps you aware of the content they're interacting with. Don't assume that platforms are screening out inappropriate material, or even that your child would recognise content as being harmful. Discuss who they follow, what posts they like and what comes up in their feeds: if alarm bells ring, it could be time for a more in-depth talk or to seek support.

4. LEARN HOW TO HIDE CONTENT

If your child stumbles across unsuitable content on social media, there's the option to hide that post as well as indicating you'd prefer any similar material not to be suggested in future. On some platforms, you might also be able to block posts that contain specific words, which is an excellent way to start taking control of what your child sees online.

5. SET DAILY LIMITS

Phones and most apps can tell you how much they're being used. Spending too long online can mean a child misses out on other activities that are important to all-round wellbeing. You could set some family rules – for everyone to follow – around device use, such as screen time limits and tech-free spaces: involving your child in creating this agreement makes them more likely to stick to it.

6. MONITOR THEIR ACTIVITY

Keeping a discreet eye on how your child is using social media can help ensure they're not entering potentially dangerous situations. As they grow up, of course, children need space to exercise their independence – but you can still occasionally ask to see what they're looking at. Be transparent about your own social media use and try not to sound judgemental about your child's.

7. TURN OFF PUSH NOTIFICATIONS

Even for adults, it's tempting to check an email or message as soon as the alert sound pings. Push notifications encourage people to open their apps and spend time on their device, so turning them off will help your child to practise mindful use of tech. Most of us have other things that we need to focus on as a priority – and those notifications will still be there later, when we have more time.

8. USE DEVICES TOGETHER

Giving children internet-enabled devices and complete freedom to explore platforms on their own can result in exposure to hugely damaging content. You could consider making a particular area at home a designated space to use phones, tablets and so on – making it much easier to monitor what content your child is viewing and (if necessary) steer them away from any potentially harmful paths.

9. ENCOURAGE OTHER ACTIVITIES

Mental health professionals often highlight the importance of exercise, quality time with loved ones, a balanced diet and restful sleep for our mental wellbeing. Spending hours on social media can cause us to sacrifice other activities that our brains need to feel well – so encouraging your child to put down their phone and enjoy something that doesn't involve a screen can be immensely beneficial.

10. TALK ABOUT PEER PRESSURE

Most platforms default children's accounts to private, so only people they've accepted as friends can see their posts. This reduces the risk of bullying or unkind comments, but – just like offline life – the digital world can still make children feel as if they need to act or look a certain way to fit in. Talk to your child about peer pressure, and listen to any concerns so you can provide the support they need.

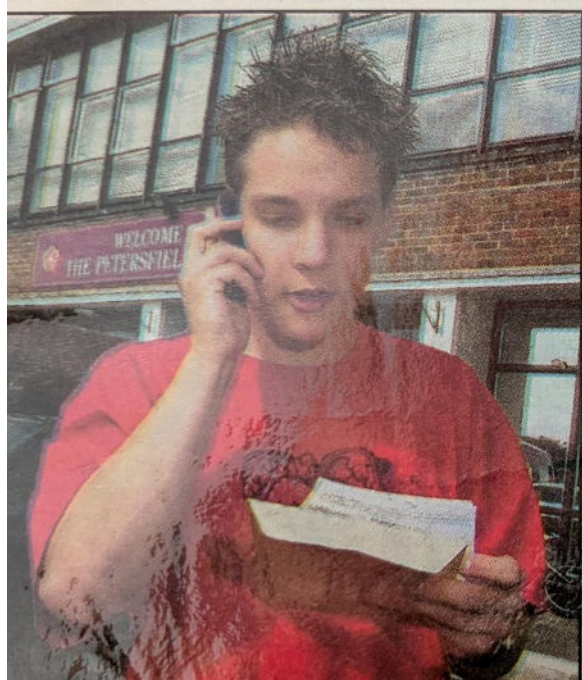
