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**Road closures between
West Meon and
Langrish affecting
Winchester to
Petersfield service 67**

Road closures between West Meon and Langrish affecting Winchester to Petersfield service 67

04 Nov 2025 to 28 Nov 2025

Cityfibre have requested the closure of the road between East and West Meon between Monday 3rd and Friday 7th November.

When the closures occur, service 67 journeys from Winchester towards Petersfield will divert from West Meon Hut direct along the A272 to Langrish and will then double run to East Meon Church. Journeys from Petersfield towards Alresford and Winchester will follow the same diversion in reverse.

From Monday 10th November for a 3 week period until Friday 28th November the cabling works will move to the section of road between East Meon and Langrish. There is insufficient time in the schedule and a lack of safe turning places for the bus to double run from West Meon Hut to serve either village, so unfortunately the bus will remain on the A272 and will omit all stops between Langrish and West Meon Hut for the duration of the closure.

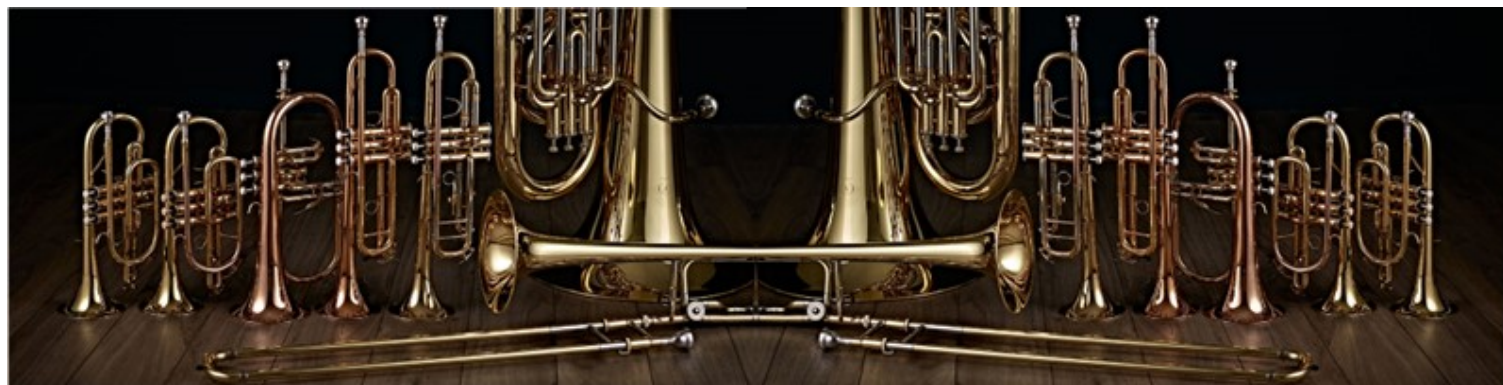

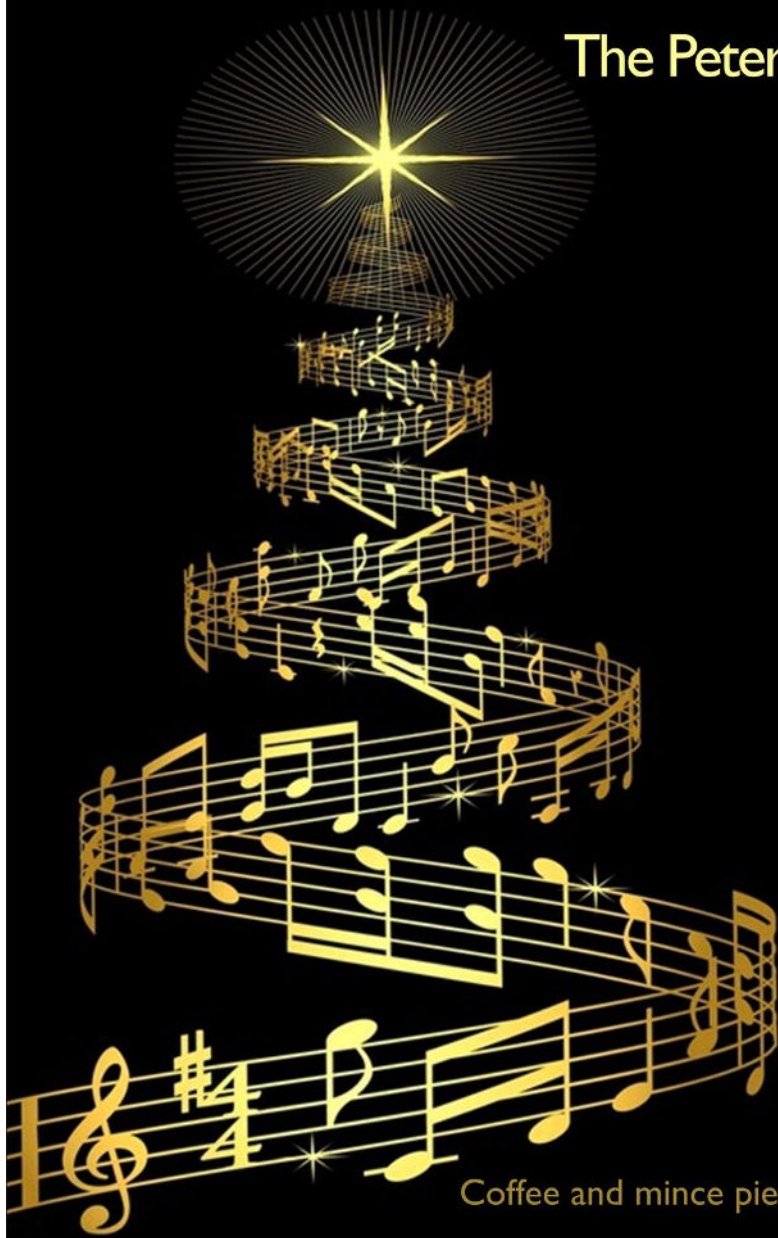

Y11 PPE Exam Timetable

E-Safety



It can be challenging for parents and carers to know whether children are spending too much time on their devices. Furthermore, it's even more of a challenge to know whether a child is addicted to the internet and social media. As technology is becoming more pervasive, children and young people are experiencing tech-related dependencies. Do we as parents and carers have the knowledge to identify and support children and young people who may be developing an addiction to their devices?

What parents need to know about SCREEN ADDICTION

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Children as young as 13 are attending 'smartphone rehab' following growing concerns over screen time. There are now help centers in the UK which deal with screen addiction for children and adults showing the seriousness of device addiction. The World Health Organisation (WHO) has officially recognised gaming addiction as a modern disease. The condition was confirmed as part of their International Classification of Diseases (ICD) which serves as an international standard for diagnosing and treating health conditions.

LACK OF SLEEP

7 out of 10 children said they had missed out on sleep because of their online habits and 60% said they had neglected school work as a result. It is important that children get the sleep they need in order to focus the next day.

LOSS OF INTEREST IN OTHER THINGS

Your child may become less interested in anything that does not include their device. You may notice that your child is missing school time and generally being less engaged with other activities in the home. It is important to discuss this with your child as soon as you notice a behaviour change.



CONFIDENCE, SUPPORT & ADVICE

The Children's Commissioner report 'Life in Likes', explored how children aged 8-11 are using social media today. It showed that children are using their devices to speak to their online friends about their problems and seek acceptance and support, removing face to face interactions.

APPS CAN BE ADDICTIVE

Apps have been designed with 'psychological tricks' to constantly keep grabbing your attention. One example of this is on the app Snapchat, where you can gain 'streaks' when interacting with your friends. If you don't respond, you lose the streak. This addictive nature of apps aims to engage children and keep them coming back for more.

Top Tips for Parents



LIMIT SCREEN TIME

In today's digital age, technology is an important part of a child's development so completely banning them from their device will mean they are missing out on a lot, including conversations and communication with their friends. Rather than banning them from using their devices, we suggest setting a screen time limit. Work out what you think is a suitable and healthy amount of time for your child to be on their device per week. Remember that your child may need to use devices for their school homework so only set screen limits on recreational time on their device. Once you have established this, have the conversation with them to discuss why you are implementing a screen limit. There will be others in your child's friendship group who will not have screen limits set and will be sending messages when they do not have access to their phones.

LEAD BY EXAMPLE

Children model their behavior on their peers, so if their parents are constantly on their device, they will see this as acceptable. Try limiting your own screen time and follow the same rules you have set for them. If you have asked your child to not use their device at the table, make sure you don't. Try setting house rules that the whole family abide by.

LESS TIME MEANS LESS EXPOSURE

There are many risks associated with devices, such as cyberbullying, grooming, sexting, viewing inappropriate content etc. Less time spent on a screen means that a child will be less exposed to these risks.

REMOVE DEVICES FROM THEIR BEDROOM

Setting a rule about removing devices from bedrooms will help your child to get the sleep they need and be more focussed the next day at school. 20% of teenagers said that they wake up to check their social network accounts on their devices. Even by having a device switched off in their bedroom, they may be tempted to check for notifications.

ENCOURAGE ALTERNATE ACTIVITIES

It may seem like an obvious solution, but encouraging children to play with their friends, read a book, or playing outdoors will help them realise they can have fun without their device. Playing football, trampolining, camping, going for a walk or swimming are all healthy replacements for screen time. Try to join them in their Outdoor activities to show your support.

MOBILE-FREE MEAL TIMES

Have you tried to settle your child by giving them a tablet at the dinner table or restaurant? This may seem like a quick fix to calm them down but in reality, it is encouraging them to use their device as a distraction from conversation and dealing with their emotions. We suggest removing all technology from the dinner table and having conversations with your family about how their day has been.

Year 11 Football vs Chi High School

The Year 11 Boys continued their search for their first piece of silverware at TPS. On Monday they took on one of the top teams in Chi High who had only been beaten once this season. The boys started brightly and opened the scoring through Alex. After then some initial pressure TPS scored a second through Seb. The game then started to open up and the boys controlled the game well. Goals from Alex and Adam sealed the win. The boys now have Bishop Luffa, The Regis and SPH as their final games of the season.

Year 7 Football vs Bishop Luffa (Chichester Fed League)

The Year 7 boys team looked to try and continue their unbeaten run this year as they hosted Bishop Luffa in the start of their Chichester Federation League Campaign. The boys started well and scored through Teddy before the pressure from the opposition began to mount. 2 Goals from Bishop Luffa meant that they took a 2-1 lead at half time. The boys continued to work hard but struggled to create chances and maintain possession. 2 penalties from the opposition and 2 further goals from open play sealed the win for Bishop Luffa. A constellation goal from Freddie concluded the fixture with Bishop Luffa winning 6-2 overall. The boys now travel to HTC on Thursday in the Havant Fed League.

Year 8 Football vs HTC and Crookhorn (Havant Fed League)

After a difficult season, the TPS boys started their Havant League Campaign looking to get off to a good start away to HTC and Crookhorn. The boys played some excellent football against tough opposition. Jax and Wiktor particularly shining for the TPS boys. TPS managed to come away with 4 points from the evenings game, a great response and a continued sign of resilience from a great set of players.

Wednesday 12th November

Year 9 Boys vs Court Moor (National Cup Round 3)

Year 9 have been the team to watch in cup competitions for the last couple of years and they travelled to Court Moor school in Fleet to see if they could set up a 4th round tie away at Howard of Effingham. We started slowly and the home team piled on the pressure. Two early headers gave Court Moor a 2-0 lead at half time. The boys continued to battle hard and despite some early pressure conceded a third against the run of play. Unphased by this TPS came back immediately to make 3-1 through Ollie. Some late half chances gave TPS hope but unfortunately we were unable to find any further breakthroughs. The boys have a bye in the County Cup Round 2 and are looking forward to finding out their opponents for round 3.

Year 11 Girls vs Kings (National Cup Round 2)

The U16 girls faced a strong Kings' side in their second-round county cup match. Tight defending in the first half limited the opponents' chances, and the team went into halftime trailing only 1–0. 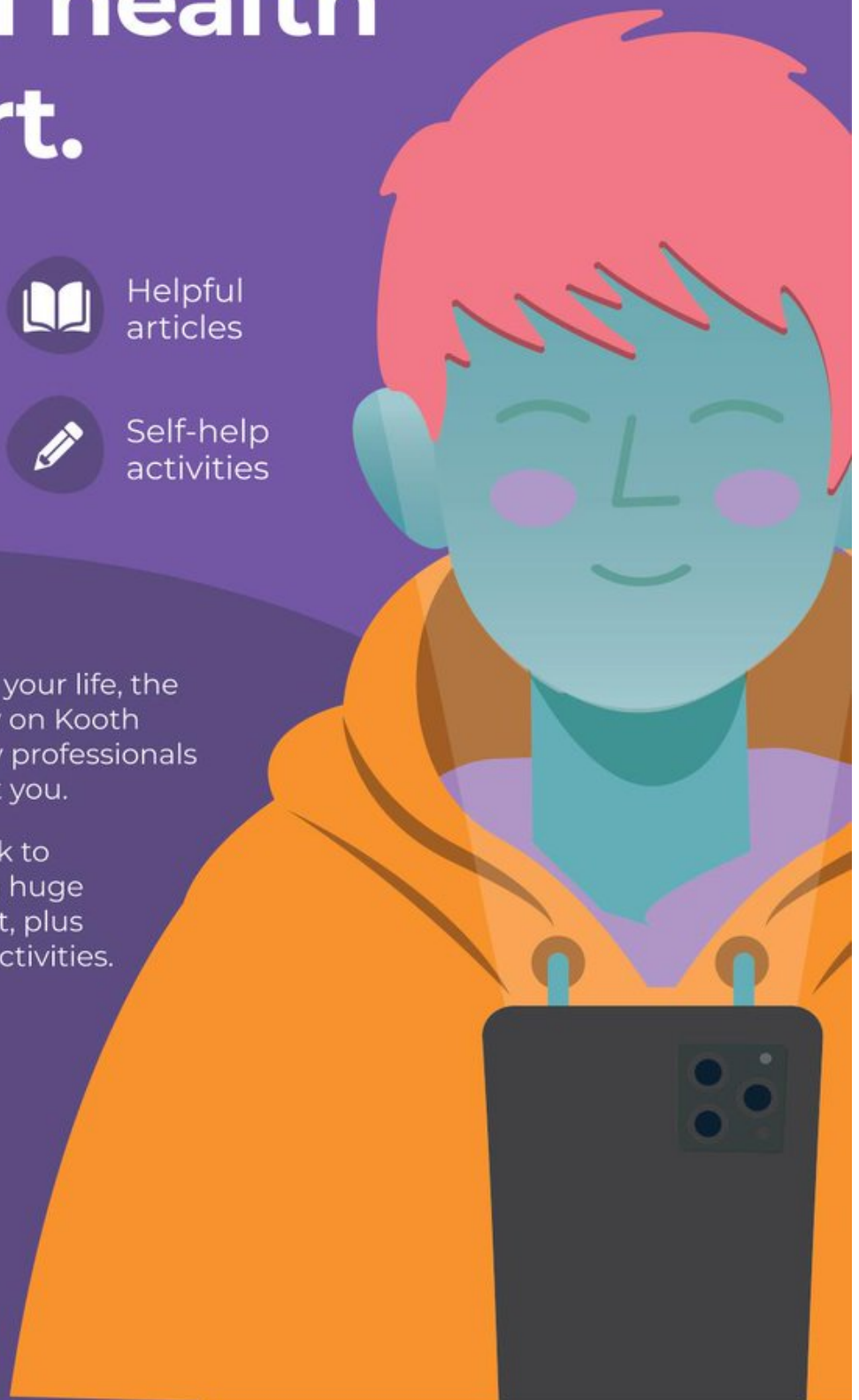

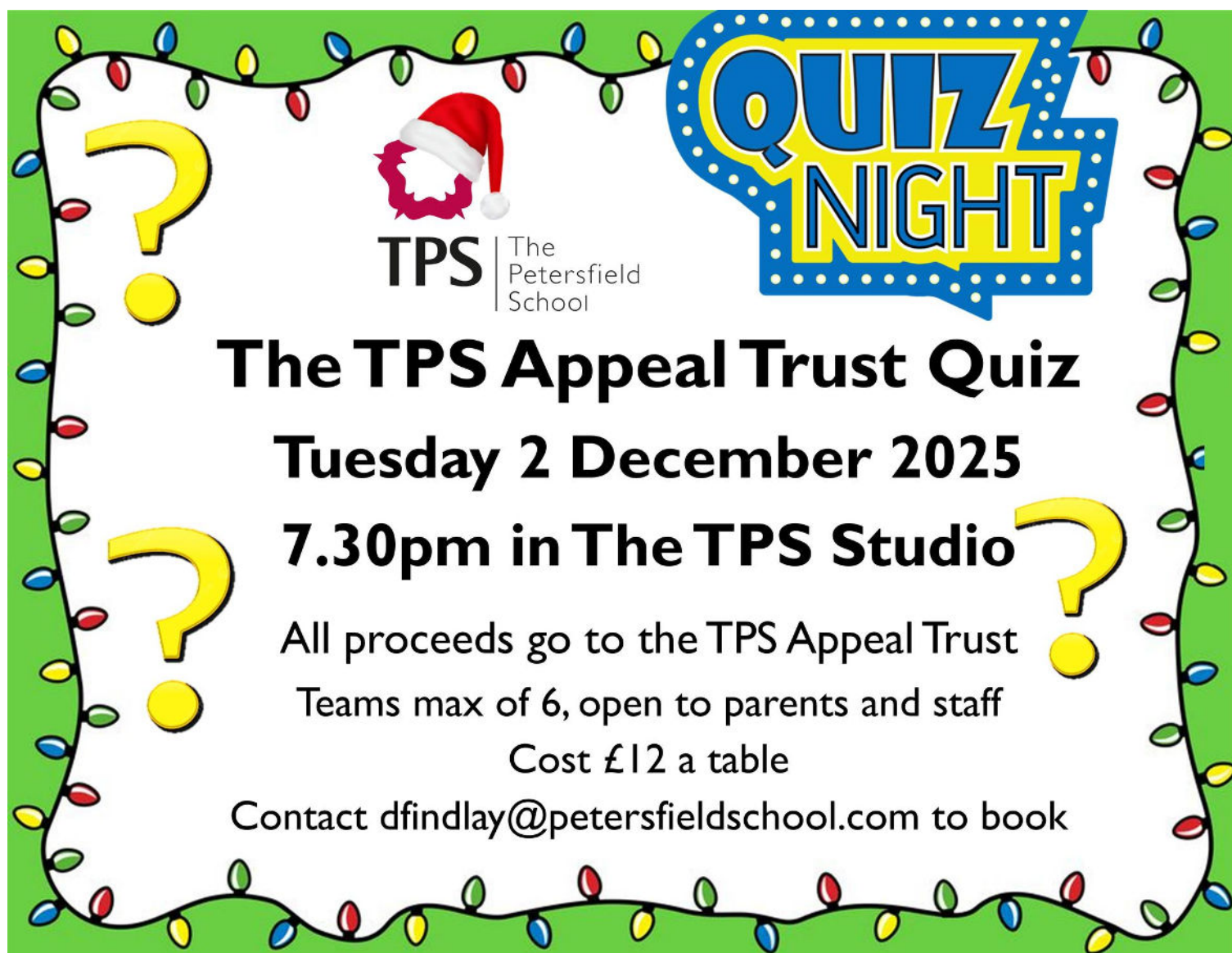


Paid Opportunity - Host Families Wanted for UK-China Cultural Exchange Programme!
