This year, our student body took the lead by voting for the charities we're supporting, and our senior students did a fantastic job presenting them during house assemblies last week.

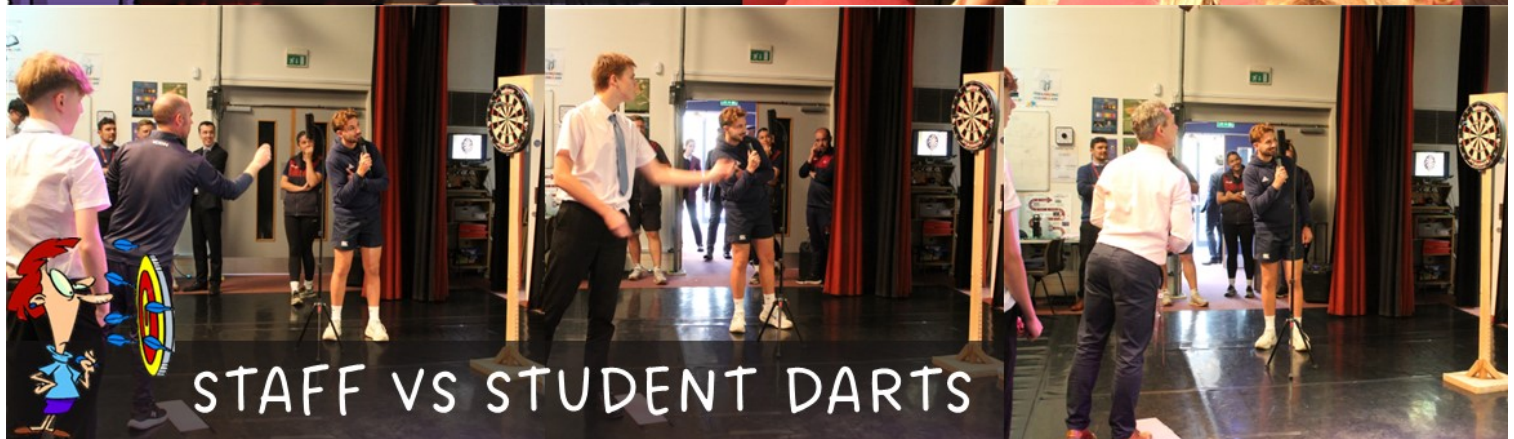
Wednesday's non-uniform day was a colourful success! If your child hasn't had a chance to donate yet, there's still time — ParentPay remains open for contributions.

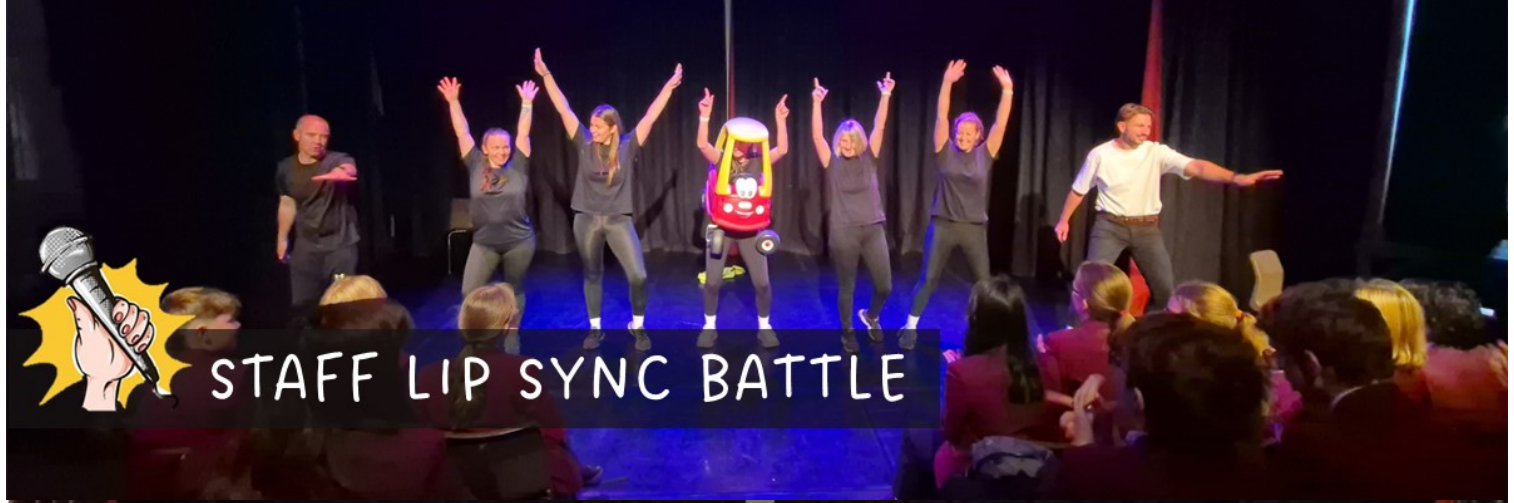
