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TPS placed 13th in The Times Parent Power 2026 table!



TPS has been ranked 13th nationally of non-selective schools in the 2026 Times Parent Power league table, marking a milestone in the School's commitment to academic achievement and holistic education.

This ranking, which includes the top 400 state schools, comes on the back of record-breaking GCSE results this year: the 2025 cohort saw more than 84% achieve grade 4 (C) or above in both English and Maths, and over one-third of all grades awarded were in the top grade band (7-9 / A*/A).

We are absolutely delighted by this national recognition. It reflects the hard work, resilience and ambition of our students, their families and our staff. At TPS, we endeavour not only to achieve excellence academic results but to build character, nurture curiosity and prepare our young people for life beyond school.

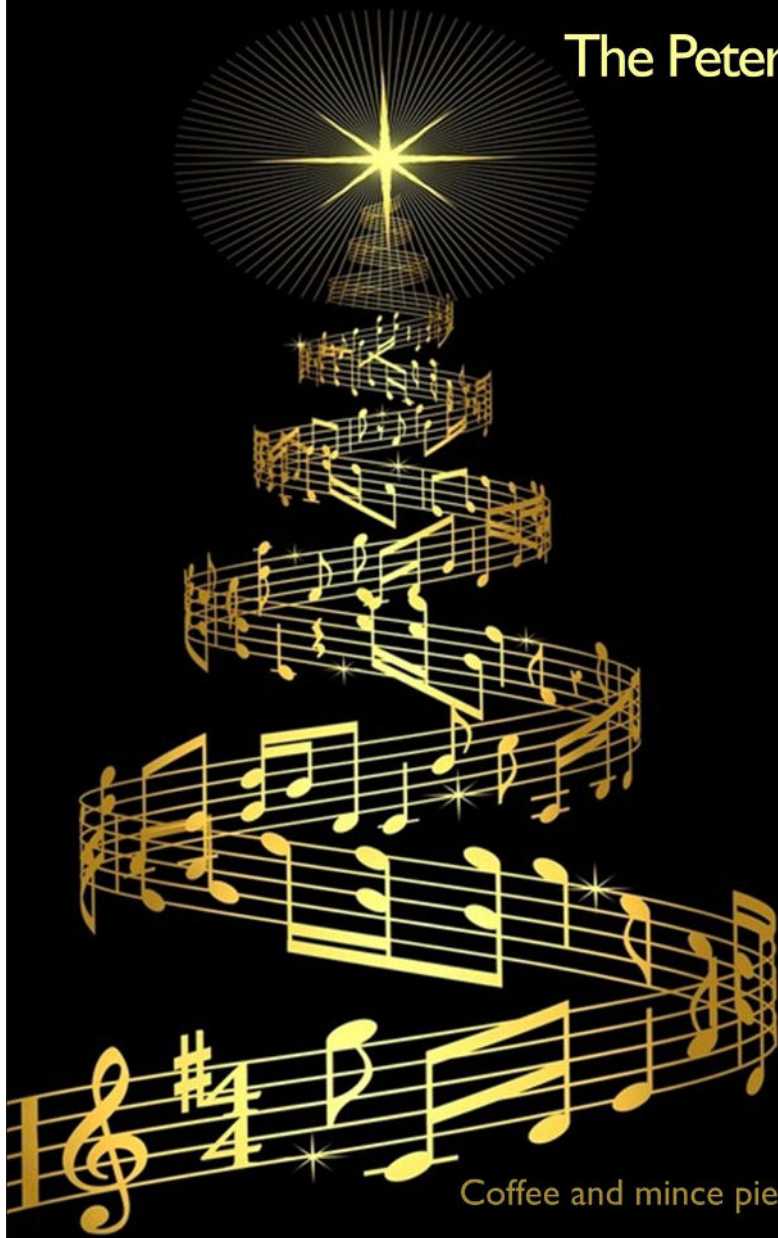

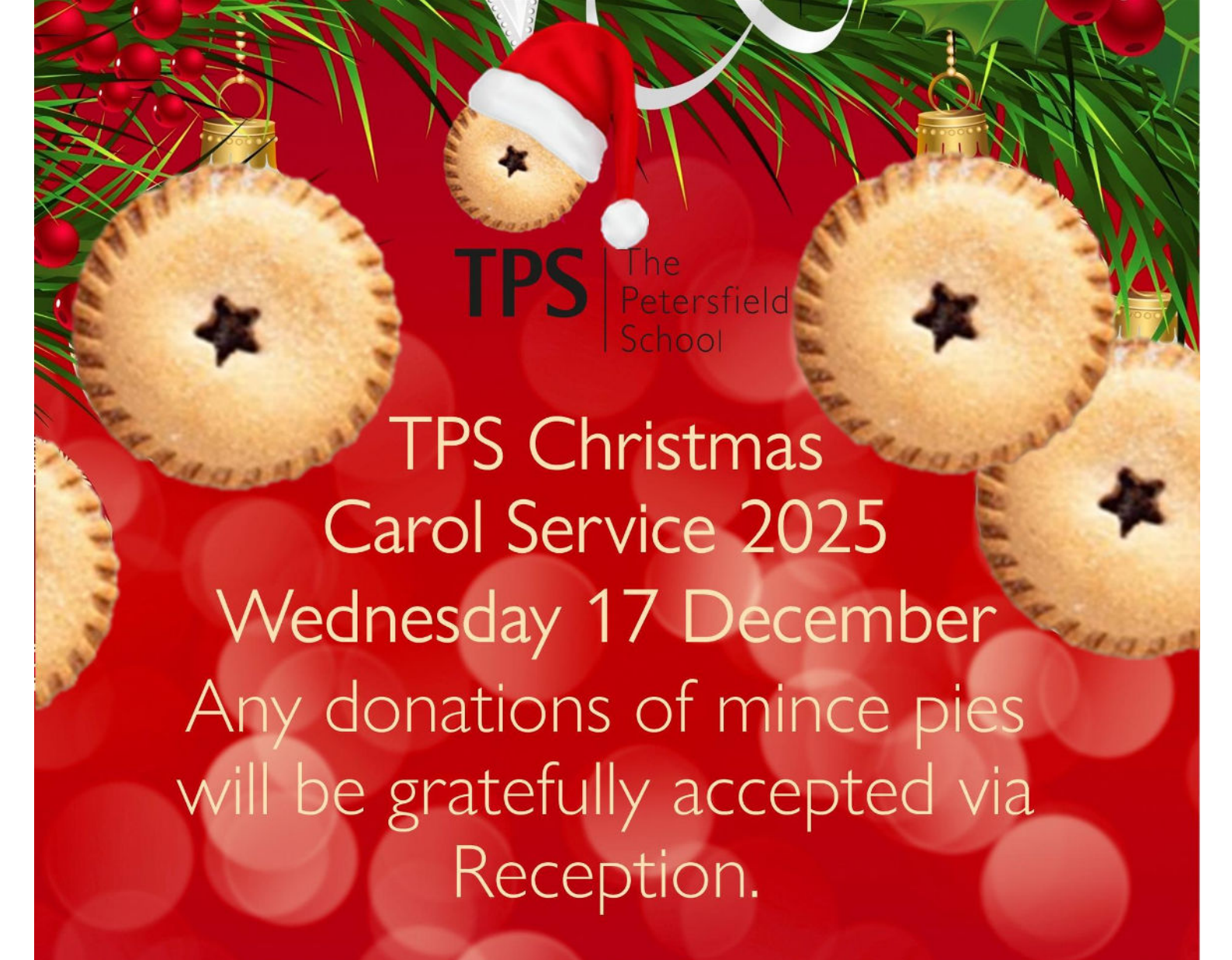

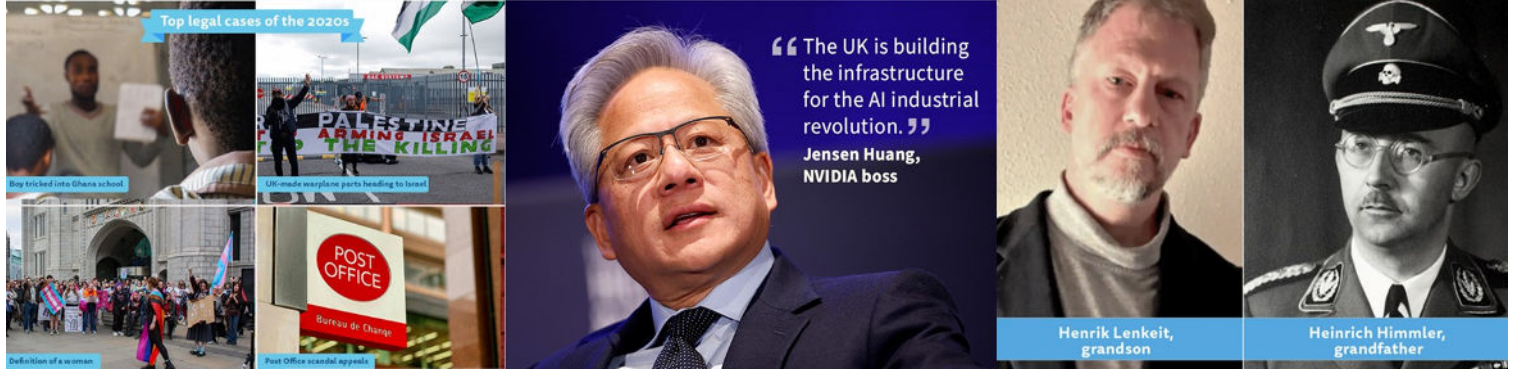


Since launching in September, TPS Talks has already taken students on an impressive journey through a wide range of real-world issues.

This term's discussions have explored everything from the surprising influence of the gut microbiome on our mood and behaviour, to the true meaning of Advent and whether Christmas has become overly commercialised. Students have stepped into the world of law, examining Britain's complex court system and debating whether justice can ever be perfectly fair. They have also confronted difficult questions of historical responsibility through the story of a German priest uncovering his family's Nazi past, and reflected on ethics and public trust while considering whether underpaying tax -highlighted by the recent Angela Rayner stamp duty controversy - is as bad as theft.

In just one term, TPS Talks has sparked thoughtful, mature debate across science, ethics, history and society, establishing itself as a powerful new platform for critical thinking and meaningful discussion.

TPS Talks continues to empower our young people to engage with the world, ask big questions and build the skills they need to become thoughtful, informed citizens. Thank you to students who have enriched classroom discussion in curriculum subject lessons with the TPS Talks topics that they have covered and a thank you to parents for carrying on the conversation about these global issues around the dinner table or on the school drop off with your child.

Year 10 Rugby vs The Island Free School: County Plate Round 2

From there, TPS shifted into top gear. The tries began to flow, with both James N and Tom B securing impressive braces. Well-constructed team moves saw further scores from Luis C, Ivo WS (finishing off a superb KFC from Tom B), Adam S and Tommy W, rounding off a dominant 51-7 victory.

Attention now turns to Monday's clash with Ringwood. Last year's meeting ended in a tight 29-26 defeat, and after this commanding performance, the boys will be eager to set the record straight.

KS4 Cross Country

This Wednesday was the district round of the Schools Cross Country Championships. So far this year all our cross country has been team events however this was the first individual race of the year.

We took 12 of our athletes to try and qualify for the next round, with all 12 meeting the top 16 qualifying places for their races which is an amazing achievement. A big congratulations to Luca D G and Freya K for convincingly winning both their races.

Year 10 Girls National Cup Round 3 vs Salesians

The second half continued in the same positive fashion. Goals from Connor O'B and Freddie P extended the lead to 3-0 and put TPS in a strong position. Park, however, showed real determination. They chased every ball and pushed a high line to test the TPS defence. Despite some excellent saves

from Tom M and crucial recovery tackles from Seb C and Rayne R, Park fought their way back into the match and reduced the deficit to 3–2.
