Hi there, I'm Daniel Findlay and as well as running the Maths Department at TPS I am involved in running the TPS Appeal Trust.

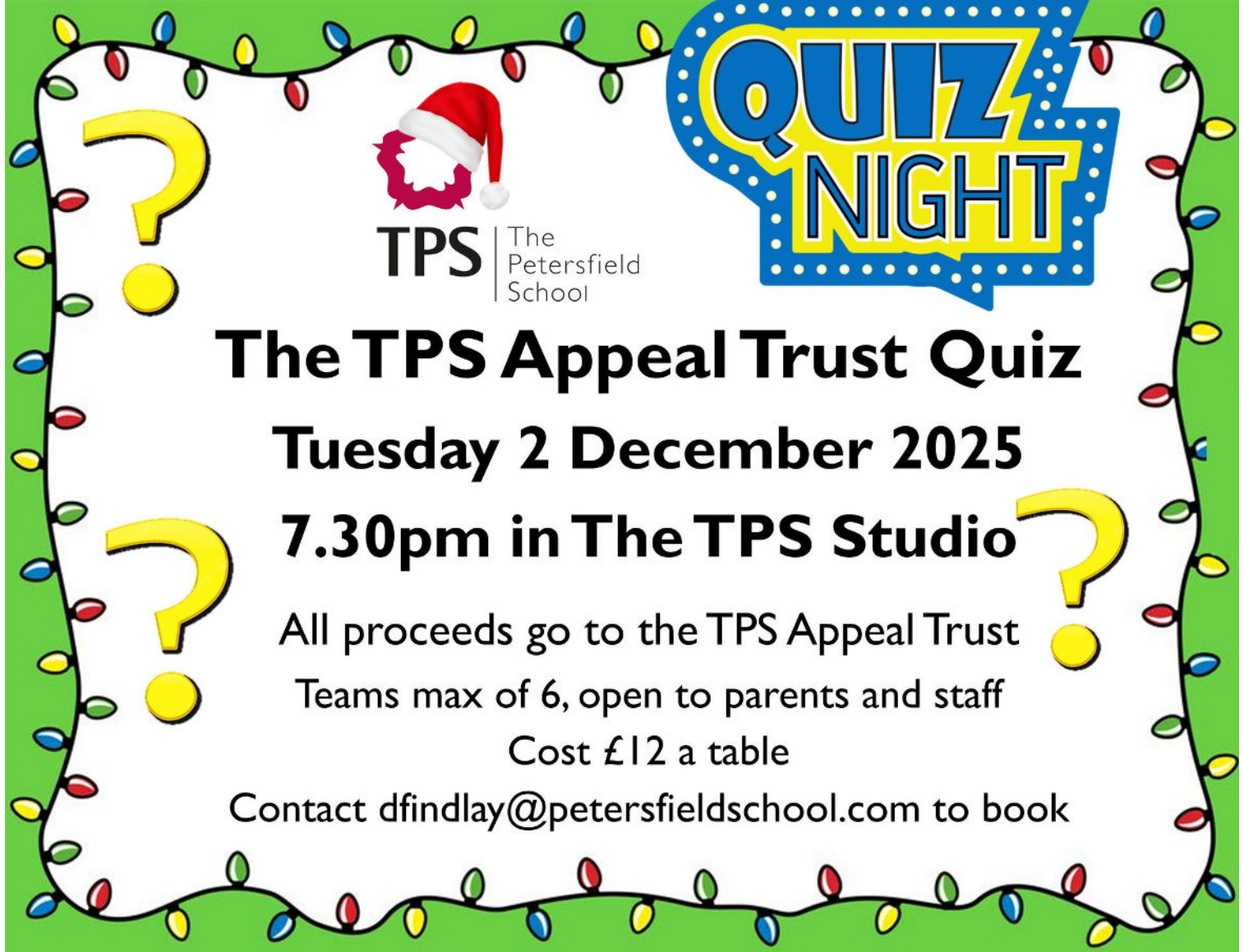

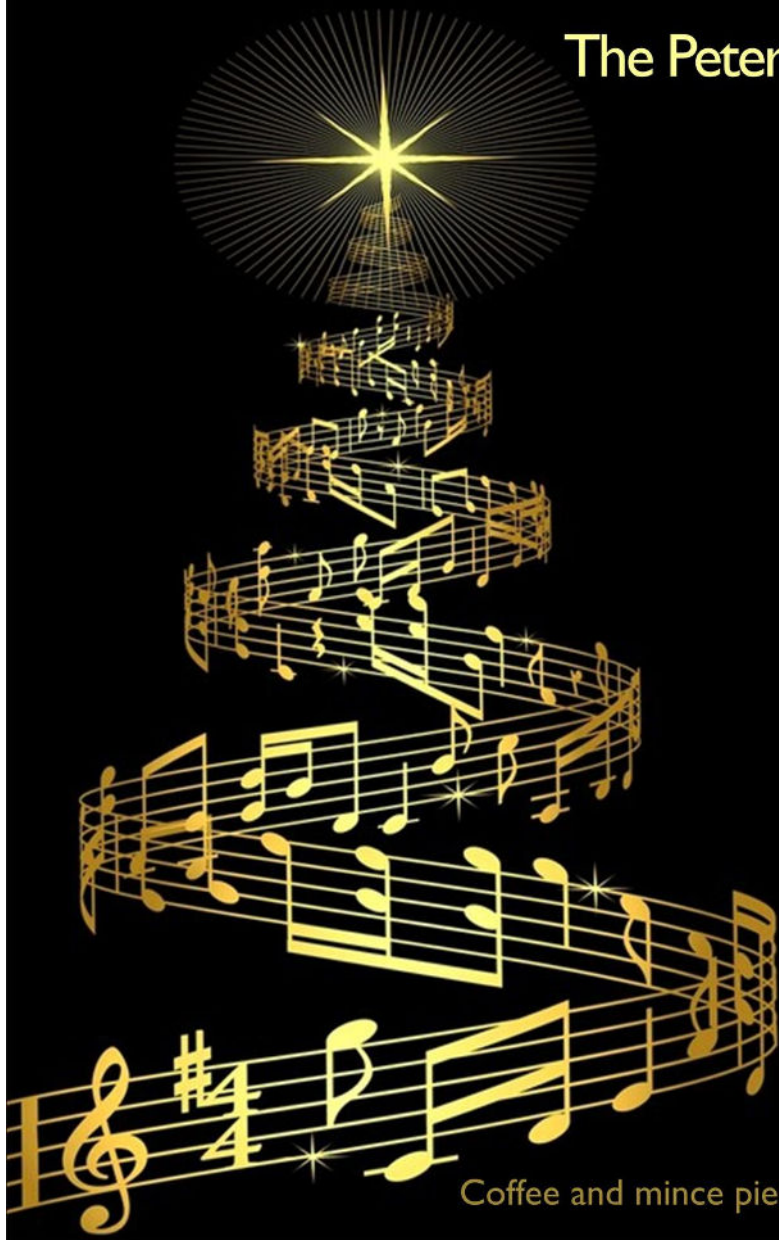

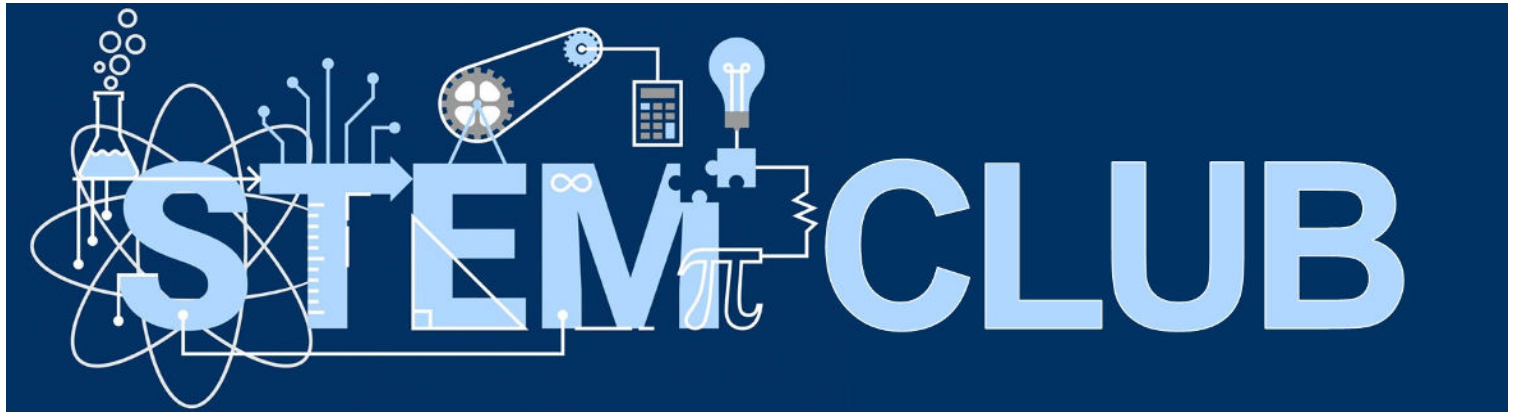


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STEM Club for girls
