New DfE mobile phone guidance to schools and possible under 16s social media ban

It's been a busy week for the topic of smartphones, social media and young people! We were delighted to see at the start of the week the government [issue guidance to all schools](#) which follows the TPS approach of being a phone free environment. As we have seen, the benefits for students and their learning are huge and we really welcome this new national approach.

You might also have seen that the government is launching a consultation on [banning social media](#) for under-16s, following the example set by Australia which came into force at the end of last year. As education professionals, everyday we see the very negative effects that excessive social media use has on young people. Those of us who have been teaching since before the widespread introduction of smartphones and social media into teenage life, have witnessed a steep decline in their overall wellbeing and have seen firsthand that the more young people use social media, the less happy they are. The research on this topic is [currently being collated](#) and will be released in the next World Happiness Report from the UN and the University of Oxford in March.

It was also interesting this week to see the [House of Lords vote overwhelmingly](#) for a swift ban social media for under 16s. This proposal will now go back to the House of Commons for a vote. The parent grassroots movement, [Smartphone Free Childhood](#), has a very simple and quick way on their website for you to contact your MP if you feel strongly about this issue [here](#).

At TPS we will continue to educate our young people on how to stay safe in the digital world and how best to protect their wellbeing. Thank you for your ongoing support and help with this important issue.

The cost for the full day will be £31.50 per student. If you would like your child to take part but have concerns about meeting the payment, then please do contact me via email in advance to discuss further.

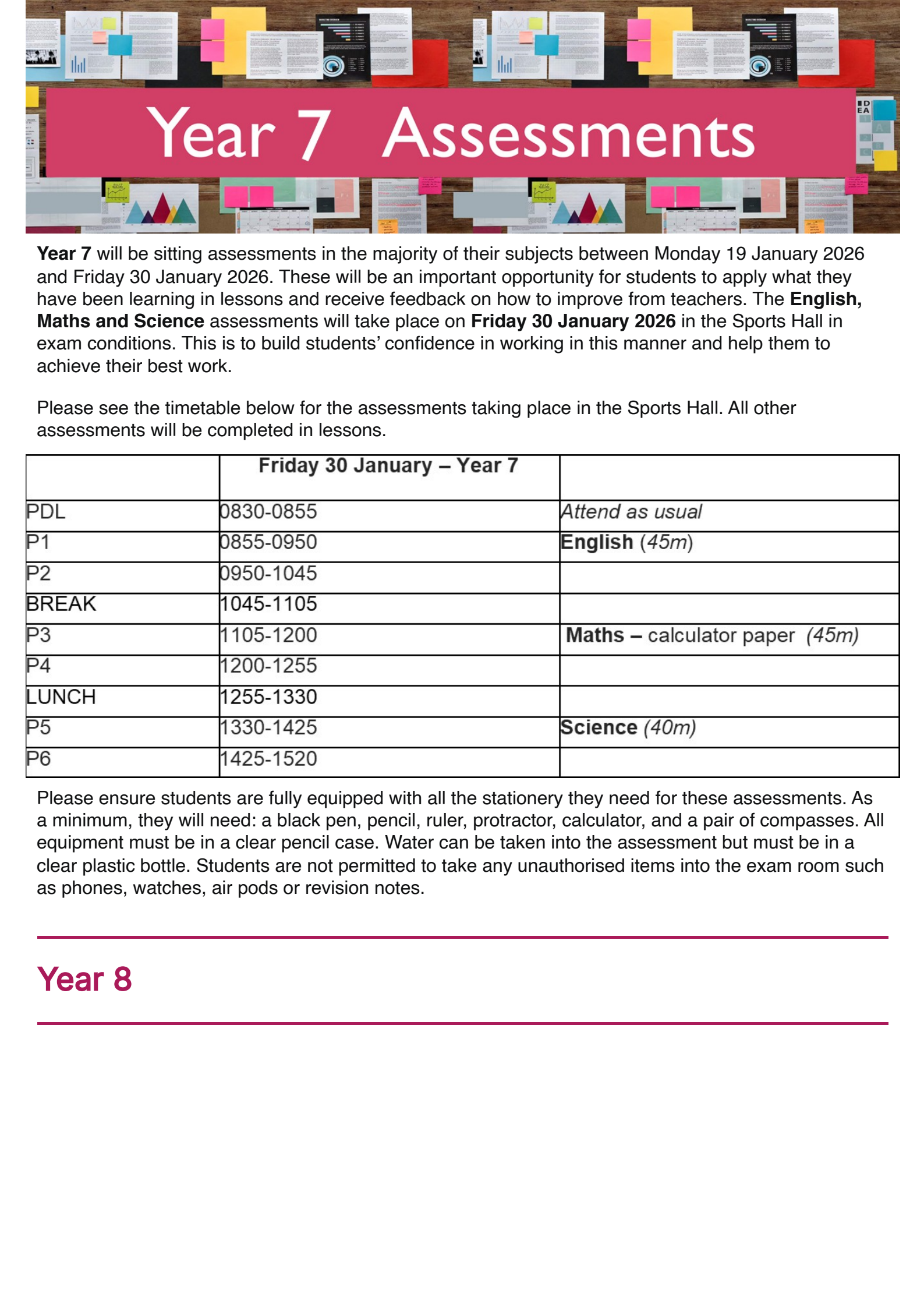

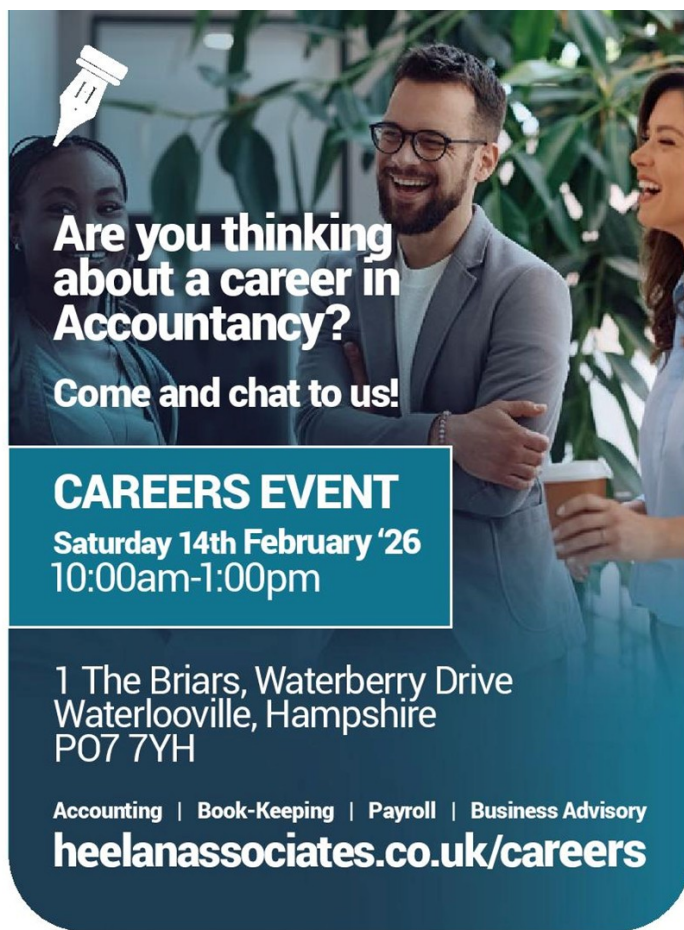

All afternoon exams (for both the PPEs and GCSEs) will begin at 1.30pm and students are required to be in attendance for the full duration of the exam.

We also recommend a highlighter for highlighting questions All equipment must be in a clear pencil case.

Water can be taken into the assessment but must be in a clear plastic bottle. Students are **not** permitted to take any unauthorised items into the exam room such as phones, watches of any kind, air pods or notes.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

SOCIAL MEDIA & MENTAL HEALTH

An estimated one-third of children have a social media account, so it's important that trusted adults know what content young people are consuming, what they're posting and the interactions they're having. On social media, it can be easy to go down 'rabbit holes' that aren't beneficial to our wellbeing. As platforms grapple with managing such 'legal but harmful' content, lives are being impacted – sometimes to tragic effect. We might be daunted by the scale of the tech giants and their content which so enthralls young people, but we can still help children to be aware of their mental wellness: recognising when something isn't OK – and knowing what to do about content that upsets them.

1. UNDERSTAND THE ALGORITHM

Algorithms rank content by user interest: someone who regularly interacts with sports news, say, will see the latest results at the top of their feed. Likewise, if a user browses content that can cause harm, that's what will be recommended to them in future. Someone who's had a bad day and looks for posts which reflect their mood will find similar content being suggested to them more and more.

2. AVOID THE MAIN FEEDS

Avoiding the default feeds on social media platforms limits the amount of recommended content that's shown. Users can opt to only scroll through the accounts they follow, use restricted modes, or highlight posts that they don't want to see more of. Explore the platform safety settings to see how you can take control of what your child's phone shows them when they open the app.

3. DISCUSS WHAT THEY'VE SEEN

Chatting about what your child's seen online keeps you aware of the content they're interacting with. Don't assume that platforms are screening out inappropriate material, or even that your child would recognise content as being harmful. Discuss who they follow, what posts they like and what comes up in their feeds: if alarm bells ring, it could be time for a more in-depth talk or to seek support.

4. LEARN HOW TO HIDE CONTENT

If your child stumbles across unsuitable content on social media, there's the option to hide that post as well as indicating you'd prefer any similar material not to be suggested in future. On some platforms, you might also be able to block posts that contain specific words, which is an excellent way to start taking control of what your child sees online.

5. SET DAILY LIMITS

Phones and most apps can tell you how much they're being used. Spending too long online can mean a child misses out on other activities that are important to all-round wellbeing. You could set some family rules – for everyone to follow – around device use, such as screen time limits and tech-free spaces: involving your child in creating this agreement makes them more likely to stick to it.

6. MONITOR THEIR ACTIVITY

Keeping a discreet eye on how your child is using social media can help ensure they're not entering potentially dangerous situations. As they grow up, of course, children need space to exercise their independence – but you can still occasionally ask to see what they're looking at. Be transparent about your own social media use and try not to sound judgemental about your child's.

7. TURN OFF PUSH NOTIFICATIONS

Even for adults, it's tempting to check an email or message as soon as the alert sound pings. Push notifications encourage people to open their apps and spend time on their device, so turning them off will help your child to practise mindful use of tech. Most of us have other things that we need to focus on as a priority – and those notifications will still be there later, when we have more time.

8. USE DEVICES TOGETHER

Giving children internet-enabled devices and complete freedom to explore platforms on their own can result in exposure to hugely damaging content. You could consider making a particular area at home a designated space to use phones, tablets and so on – making it much easier to monitor what content your child is viewing and (if necessary) steer them away from any potentially harmful paths.

9. ENCOURAGE OTHER ACTIVITIES

Mental health professionals often highlight the importance of exercise, quality time with loved ones, a balanced diet and restful sleep for our mental wellbeing. Spending hours on social media can cause us to sacrifice other activities that our brains need to feel well – so encouraging your child to put down their phone and enjoy something that doesn't involve a screen can be immensely beneficial.

10. TALK ABOUT PEER PRESSURE

Most platforms default children's accounts to private, so only people they've accepted as friends can see their posts. This reduces the risk of bullying or unkind comments, but – just like offline life – the digital world can still make children feel as if they need to act or look a certain way to fit in. Talk to your child about peer pressure, and listen to any concerns so you can provide the support they need.
