I live locally to the school and enjoy gardening and cooking in my spare time.

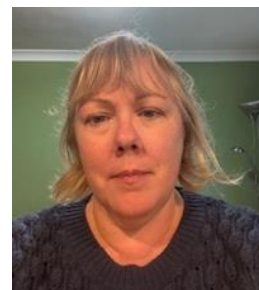


Emma Crowley
