The visit to Auschwitz offered a thoughtful and carefully guided opportunity to understand the impact of the past, approached with sensitivity and reflection. Students also ventured deep underground into the extraordinary Wieliczka Salt Mines, discovering stunning chambers and intricate salt-carved sculptures. The trip concluded at Schindler's Factory Museum in Kraków, where pupils learned about life in the city during World War II and the story of Oskar Schindler's efforts to protect Jewish workers.

It was a powerful and enriching experience that gave students valuable insights and lasting memories from their Easter break.

Parental Controls for iPads

What is JAMF?

JAMF is a powerful tool that enables parents and teachers to control access to apps on a young person's device. While in school hours, teachers will have control of your child's device. While at home, parents can have control over the iPad including which apps can be accessed and for how long. JAMF is time restricted. The school will have control between the hours of 8.00am and 3:30pm. Parents will have control outside of these hours. Apps restricted by either the parent or school staff will be hidden completely from the child's home screen.

'Young Power List' celebrates hard work

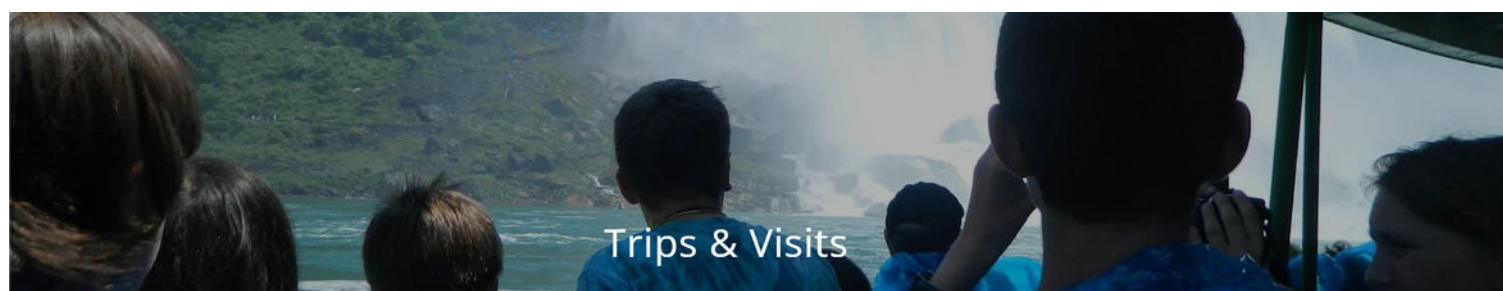
Is attitude the key to success? *The Sunday Times* has revealed its annual pick of movers and shakers under the age of 30. Many of them sing the praises of hard graft.

Ocean Health Challenge



Earlier this year, a number of students in Year 7 completed the University College London's Ocean Health Challenge, an engineering design programme to explore the urgent issue of ocean plastic pollution.

They took part in the full engineering design cycle - Understanding the problem, ideating, prototyping with reclaimed materials and pitching their solution. This national competition looked for submissions that were sustainable, original and effective.

We are excited to announce that Phoebe's submission focussing on reducing single use plastics by utilising a self serve, plastic free supermarket lunchbox system impressed the judges, earning her the Year 7 Runner up Prize!

Below is an overview of the homework students will receive each week from January.

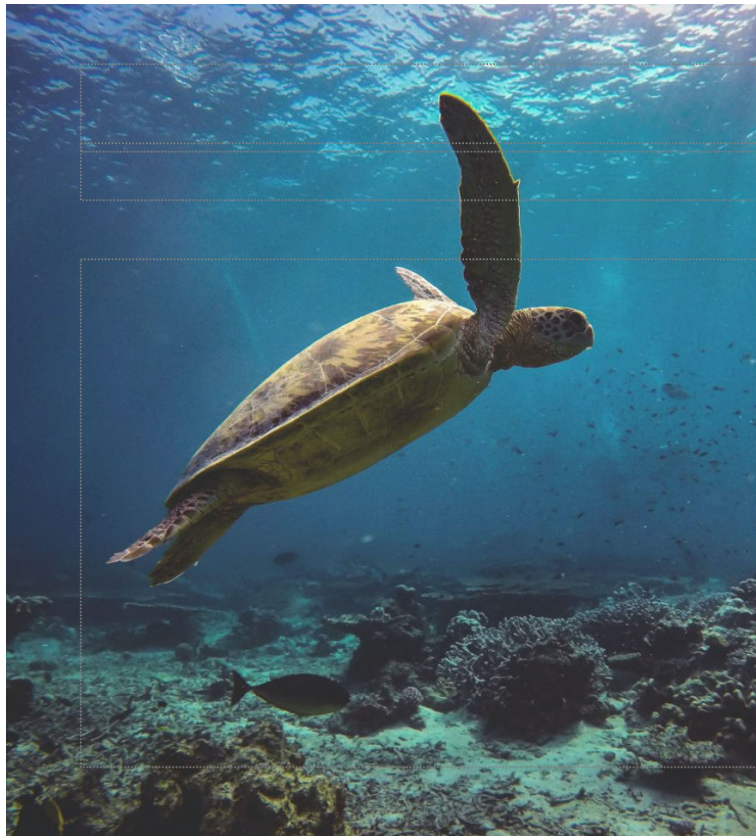

Subject	Estimated time per week
English booklet	30 minutes
Literacy (Reading Plus/Lexia)	60 minutes (plus 30 minutes completed during Literacy lesson)
Maths Sparx*	30 minutes
Science Sparx*	30 minutes
MFL	30 minutes
History OR Geography project (alternates half termly)	30 minutes

Subject	Estimated time per week
English booklet	30 minutes
Maths Sparx*	30 minutes
Science Sparx*	30 minutes
MFL	30 minutes
History OR Geography project (alternates half termly)	30 minutes
RE – Padlet article	30 minutes

We would also encourage students to complete 60 minutes of independent reading each week. This doesn't need to be submitted or formally marked – the aim is simply to help students build a regular reading habit and enjoy books of their choice.

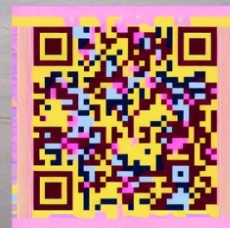

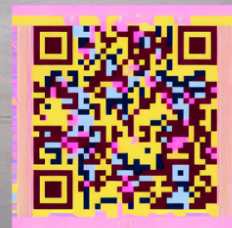

Work Experience/Take your child to work week – 29 June – 3 July. (If student is attending the Chichester taster day, they would do 4 days work experience instead of 5)

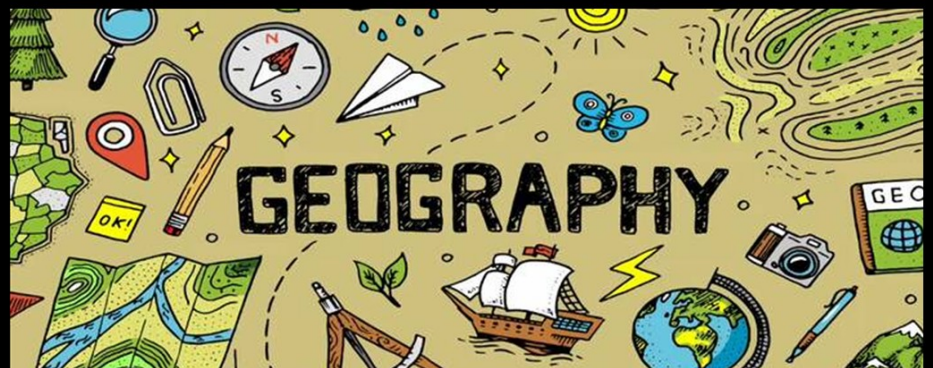

Year 11 Meal Balance Notification

With our Year 11 students due to finish school in June, we are writing to remind you to ensure that balances on school meal cards are used up and to cancel any auto top-up arrangements you have made in ParentPay.

If you are unable to use up the balance and have used ParentPay to top up the card within the last 24 months, we can refund some or all of the balance back to your ParentPay account. You will then be able to withdraw the balance from your ParentPay account or reallocate it to another fund.

We are unable to refund top-ups that are older than 24 months within ParentPay. These balances can be transferred to the school meal account of another child within the school (e.g. a sibling).

Another option suggested by parents some years ago was donation to the student welfare card. This meal card is used to assist some of our students facing the most difficult circumstances and enables students to benefit from a drink, snack or meal at a time when they most need it. This is very much appreciated by the student welfare team and the students themselves.

Please email fcooper@petersfieldschool.com to action either of these options.

Leaver balances of less than £3 are not refunded and are automatically donated to the student welfare card as detailed on the lunch top up item for which we are very grateful.

Another alternative, if your last top up on ParentPay was more than two years ago, is to request a refund from the catering company (info@accentcatering.co.uk) . The caterers will require bank details in order to action a refund for you.

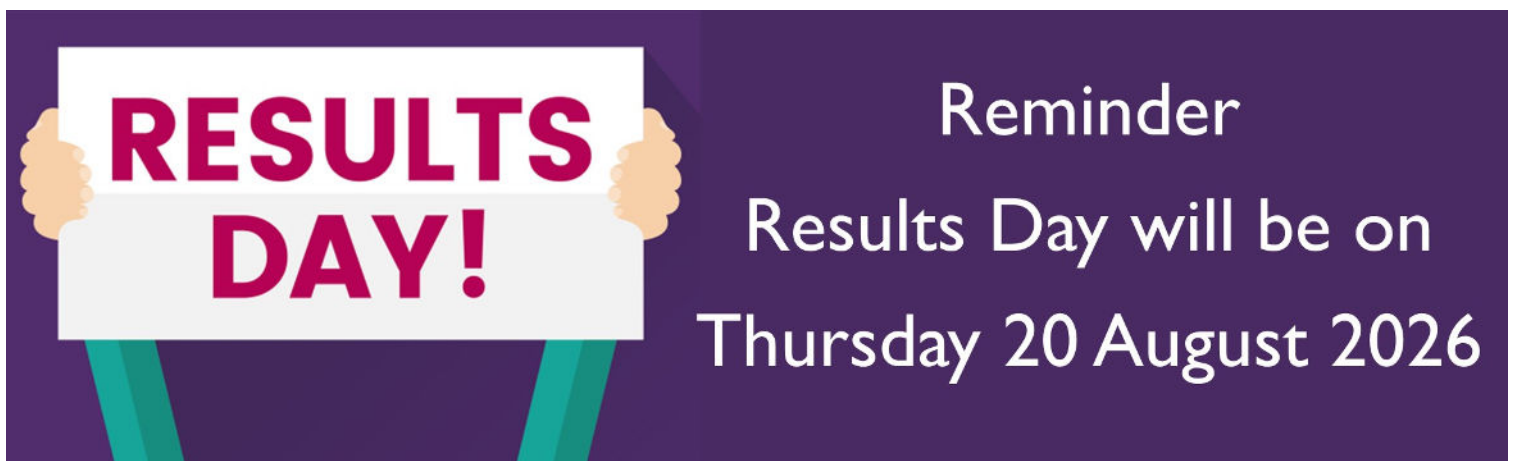

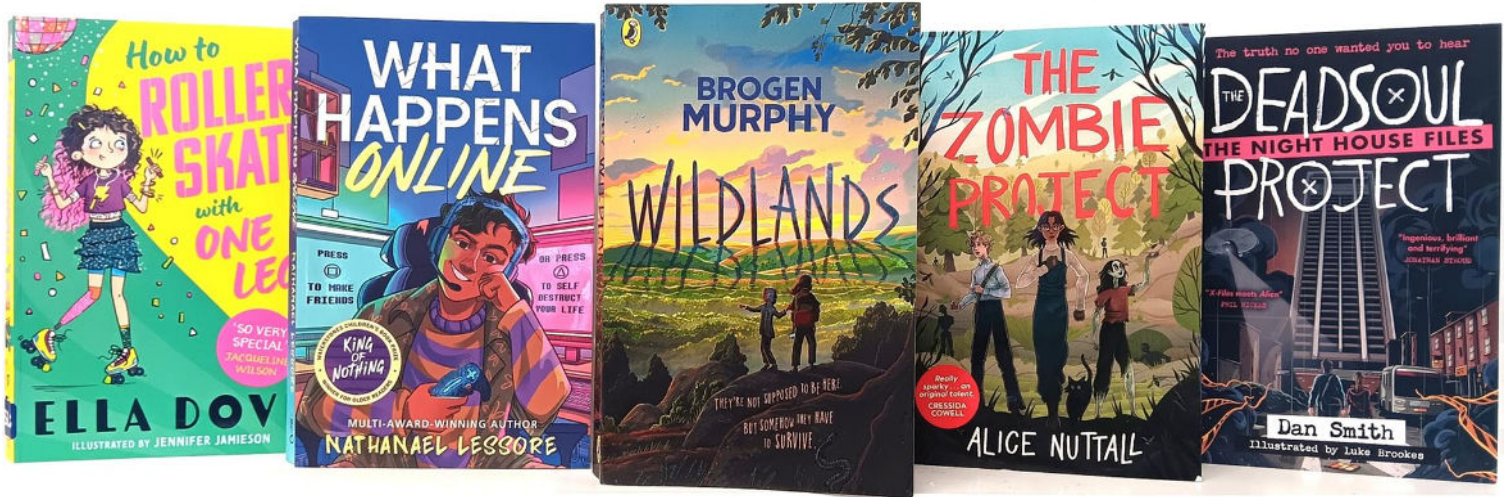
BET Book Awards 2026

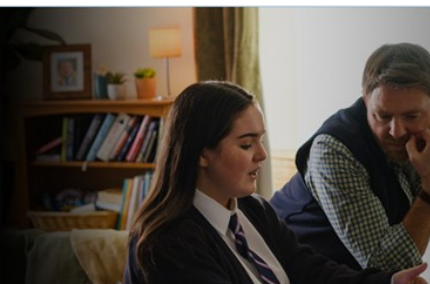

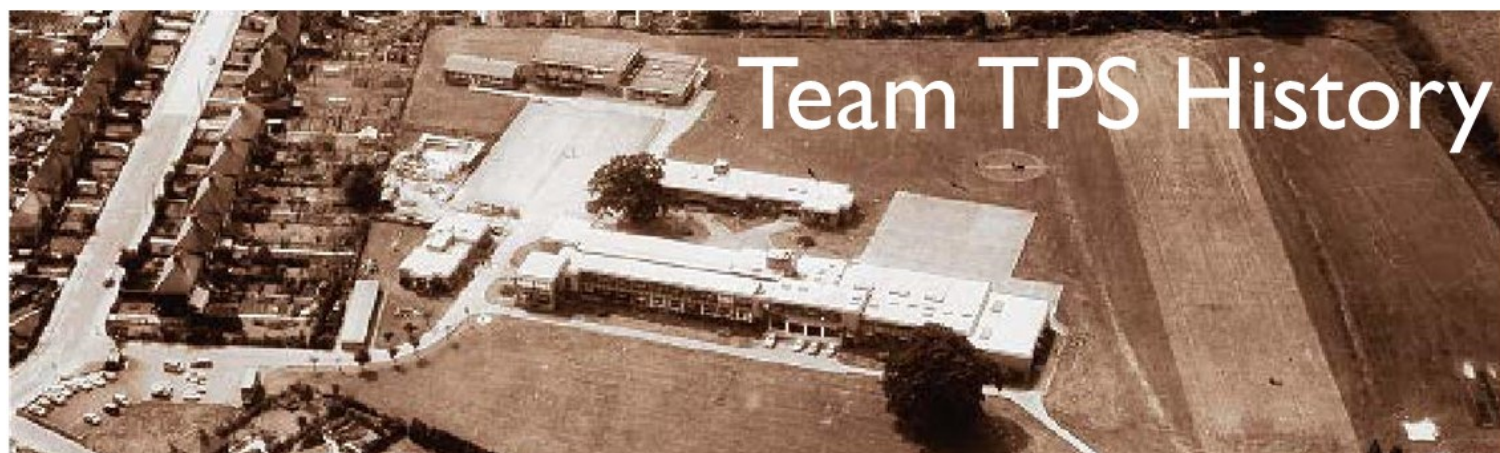

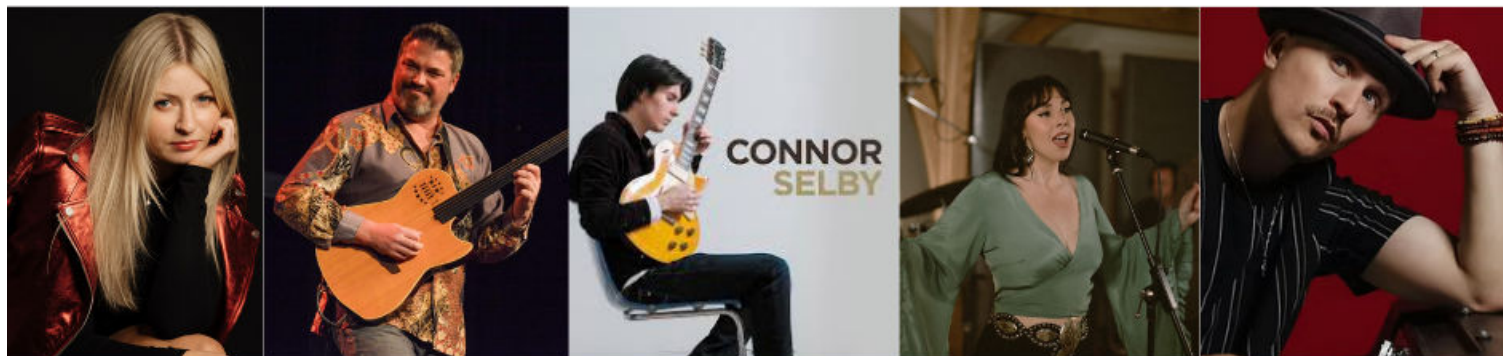
