'Overwhelming consensus' that social media harms children, top doctors say

The Academy of Medical Royal Colleges (AoMRC) has just [released a report](#) examining the impact of smartphones and social media on children and young people. The doctors say that social media is as [bad for children as smoking](#).

Representing many of the UK's most senior doctors and medical institutions, the AoMRC brings together the medical profession's collective voice at the highest level. The publication of their report signals growing recognition across mainstream medicine that excessive and inappropriate smartphone and social media use is now a serious public health concern affecting children's health and development at the population level.

The report highlights mounting concerns around children's mental health, sleep, attention, development, education, relationships and wellbeing, whilst also recognising the increasingly persuasive parallels being drawn between the tactics historically used by the tobacco industry and those now seen within parts of the technology sector. It follows recent [high profile court cases in America](#) where social media was found to be addictive and damaging for teenage mental health.

The report was published as the AoMRC's response to the government's social media consultation which ended last month. It is anticipated that [the government will set out their response to the consultation](#) and next steps, including a possible total ban on social media for children aged under 16, over the coming weeks.

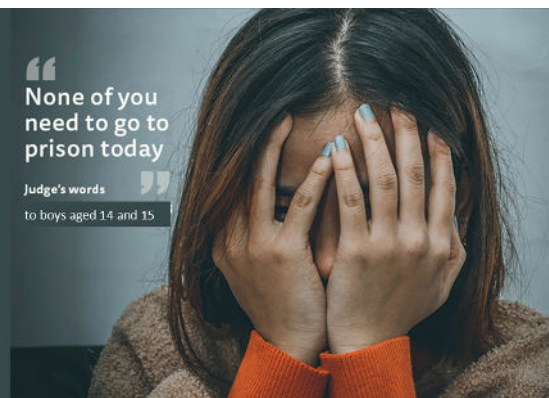


This week in TPS Talks we have discussed two important topics following recent tragic events.

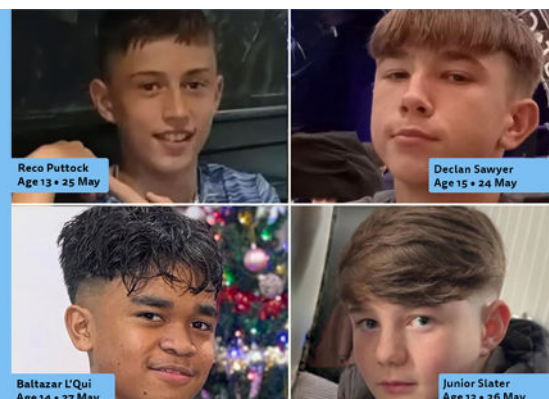

Our upper school students have been discussing whether children and teenagers should be treated differently in consequences for more serious crimes, following the criticism of the lenient sentencing of teenage boys found guilty last week. Students have been debating whether the criminal justice system is failing society by not giving children an appropriate punishment for such serious crimes.

Warning as teenagers die in cold lakes

Should schools teach lessons in risk? A week of open water drownings has posed questions over why the young are particularly susceptible and how to stop further tragedies.



The lower school have been discussing the importance of water safety following the tragic fatalities of many teenagers last week during the hot weather. Students have discussed the factors to consider

when taking risks and why it is important to understand the dangers of open water swimming in hot weather.

On Friday 12 June students studying French will have the opportunity to see a play led by French native speakers.

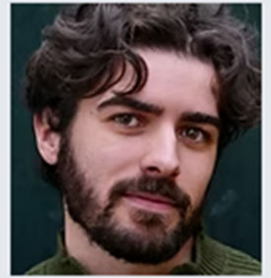
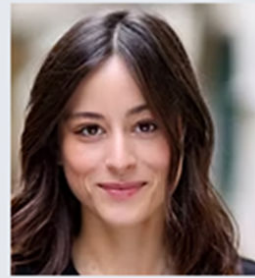
All students in Years 10, 9 and 8 and a few selected students from Year 7 will be invited to attend the performance.

Year 7 Homework

Year 7 students start the year with a lighter homework timetable to help them settle into secondary school. From January, they will move onto the full weekly homework schedule.

Below is an overview of the homework students will receive each week from January.

Please note that expressive arts subjects may occasionally set optional enrichment tasks, which students can complete if they would like to.

Subject	Estimated time per week
English booklet	30 minutes
Literacy (Reading Plus/Lexia)	60 minutes (plus 30 minutes completed during Literacy lesson)
Maths Sparx*	30 minutes
Science Sparx*	30 minutes
MFL	30 minutes
History OR Geography project (alternates half termly)	30 minutes

*Over time, the Sparx algorithm should adjust the difficulty level so that it is suitable for individual students, meaning it can be completed in 30 minutes. If you are finding that even after several weeks, your child is spending more than 30 distraction-free minutes completing Sparx, please contact your child's Science or Maths teacher.

Smartphone Policy from September 2026



We wanted to get in touch now to confirm that from September 2026 we would be **rolling up our present policy of not permitting smartphones on site** into the upper school for your child's year group.

Y8 Curriculum CHOICES

Curriculum choices update.

Now all the student meetings have been caught up we are using the software to build the timetable blocks.

Now we have the final numbers of first choices we can confirm that the following subjects will be running a single class. These are Dance, Music, French, Computer Science, Economics and Philosophy & Ethics.

The software builds the blocks to optimise the number of first choices allocated across the whole cohort, however if your child has chosen multiple subjects which are running as a single class the combinations may not work, requiring a reserve to be used.

Where this is the case the first choices allocated and which subject needs to use a reserve will be discussed with students and families.

As previously stated Design Technology has been popular as a first choice and is oversubscribed this year. Philosophy & Ethics and Dance are also marginally oversubscribed for one class and have not gained enough first choices to be able to make a second class viable.

Payments for the trips for ERA week are due

This is a reminder that payments for the day trips during ERA week are now overdue.

If you would still like your child to attend their chosen activity please make payment a.s.a.p. otherwise we will need to open the trip to other students and your child may lose their place. This reminder is for the day trips only.

RE – Padlet article	30 minutes

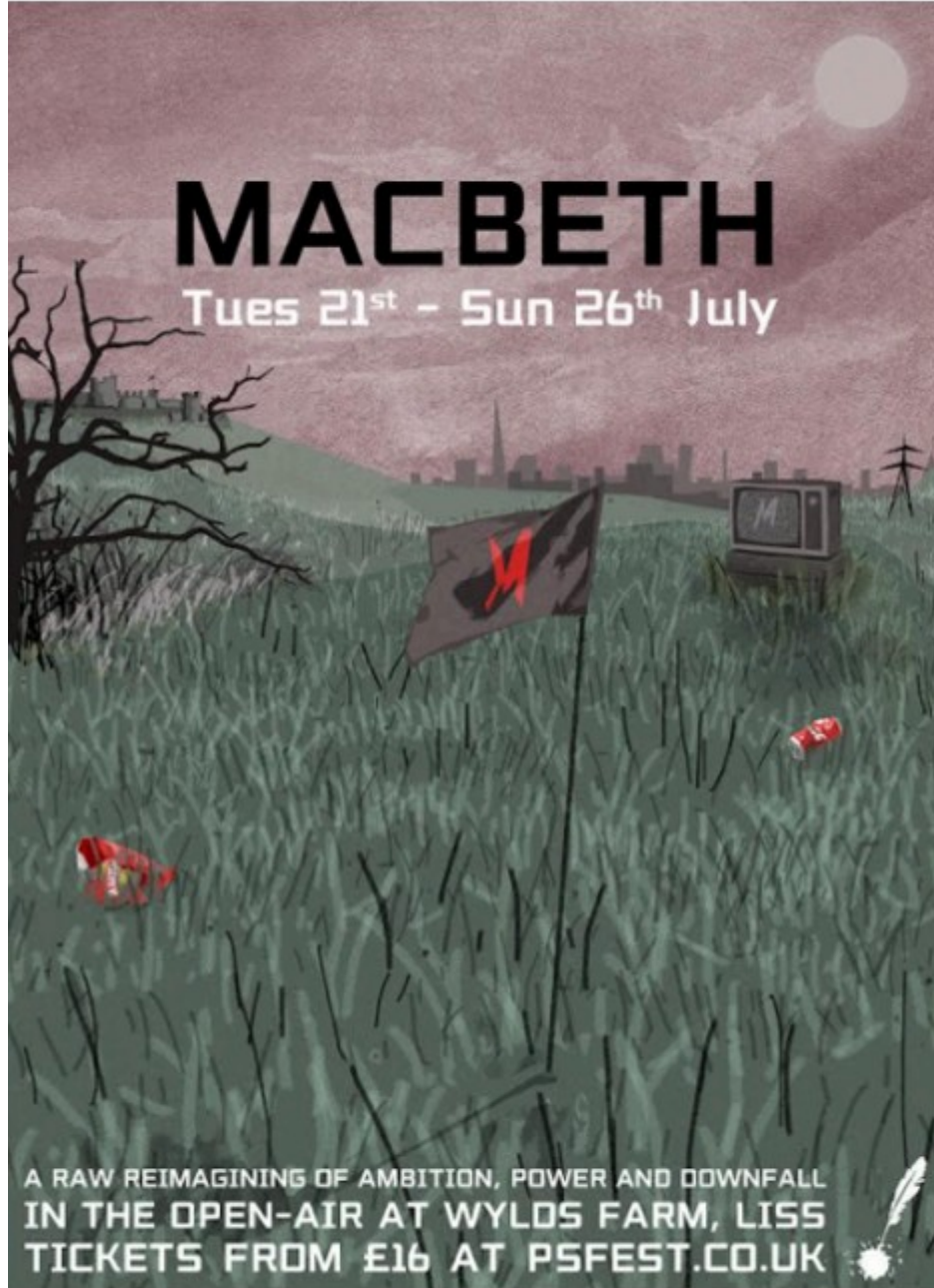
We would also encourage students to complete 60 minutes of independent reading each week. This doesn't need to be submitted or formally marked – the aim is simply to help students build a regular reading habit and enjoy books of their choice.

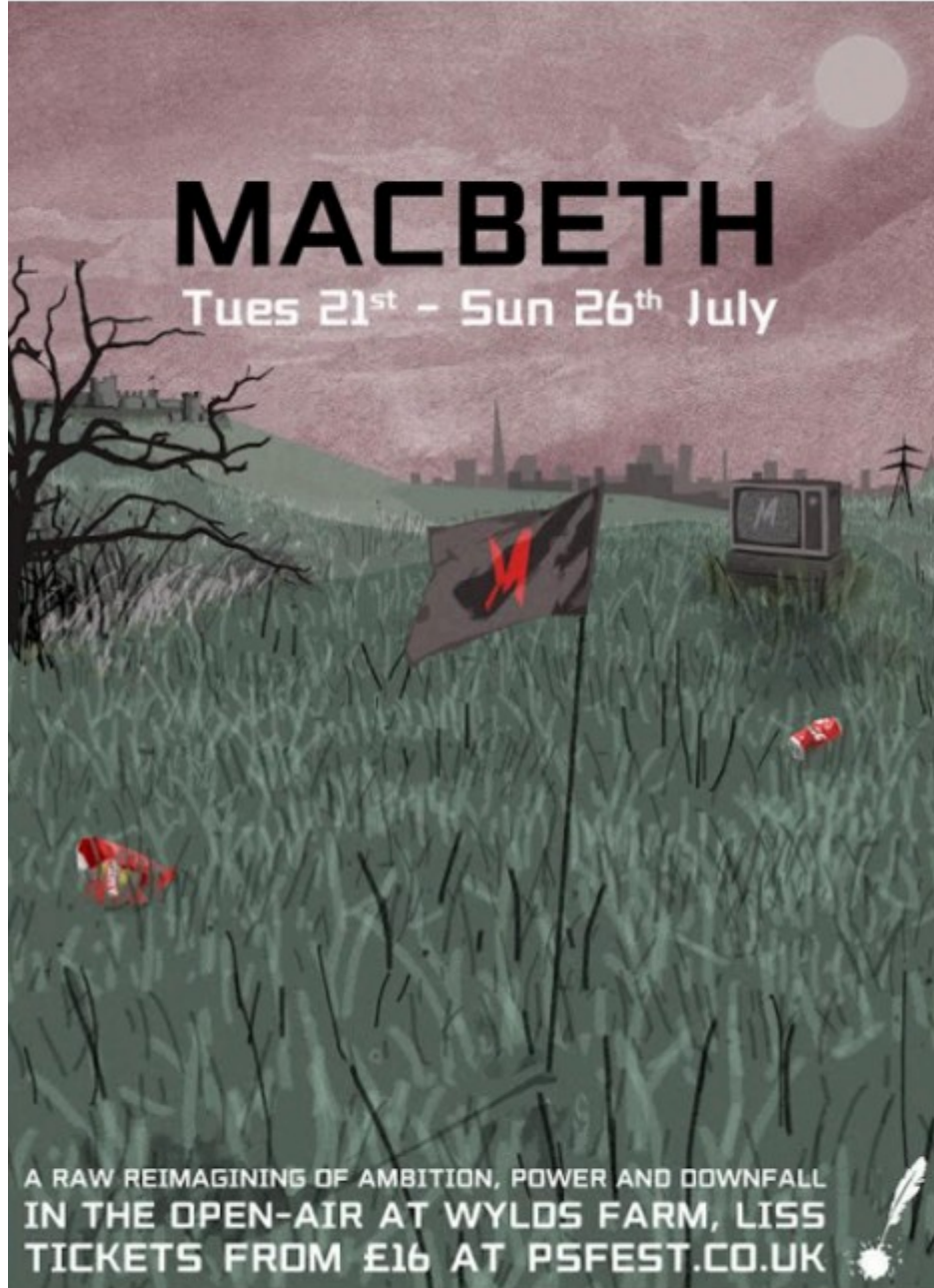
Year 10 Drama

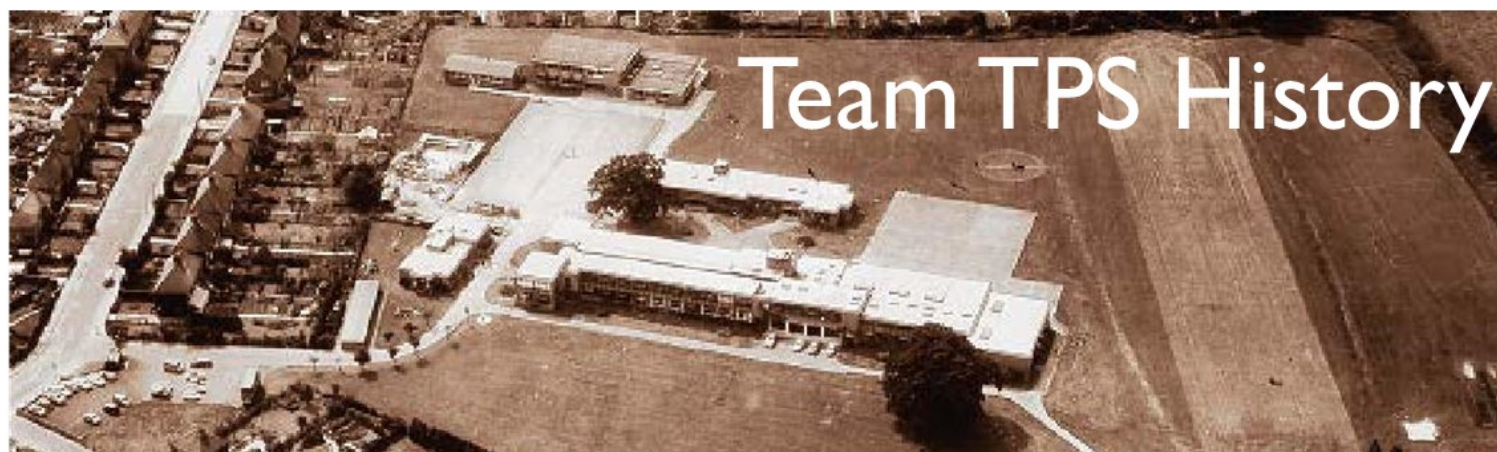

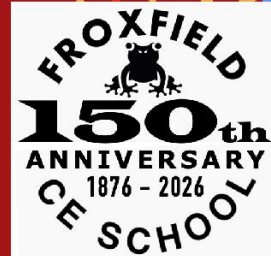
