Year 7 Homework

Year 7 students start the year with a lighter homework timetable to help them settle into secondary school. From January, they will move onto the full weekly homework schedule.

Below is an overview of the homework students will receive each week from January.

Please note that expressive arts subjects may occasionally set optional enrichment tasks, which students can complete if they would like to.

Subject	Estimated time per week
English booklet	30 minutes
Literacy (Reading Plus/Lexia)	60 minutes (plus 30 minutes completed during Literacy lesson)
Maths Sparx*	30 minutes
Science Sparx*	30 minutes
MFL	30 minutes
History OR Geography project (alternates half termly)	30 minutes

*Over time, the Sparx algorithm should adjust the difficulty level so that it is suitable for individual students, meaning it can be completed in 30 minutes. If you are finding that even after several weeks, your child is spending more than 30 distraction-free minutes completing Sparx, please contact your child's Science or Maths teacher.

Y8 Curriculum CHOICES

Curriculum choices update.

Now all the student meetings have been caught up we are using the software to build the timetable blocks.

Now we have the final numbers of first choices we can confirm that the following subjects will be running a single class. These are Dance, Music, French, Computer Science, Economics and Philosophy & Ethics.

The software builds the blocks to optimise the number of first choices allocated across the whole cohort, however if your child has chosen multiple subjects which are running as a single class the combinations may not work, requiring a reserve to be used.

Where this is the case the first choices allocated and which subject needs to use a reserve will be discussed with students and families.

As previously stated Design Technology has been popular as a first choice and is oversubscribed this year. Philosophy & Ethics and Dance are also marginally oversubscribed for one class and have not gained enough first choices to be able to make a second class viable.

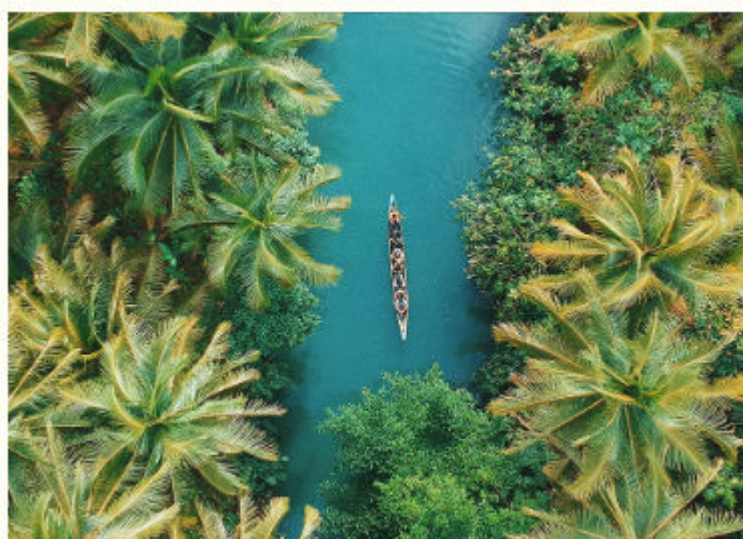

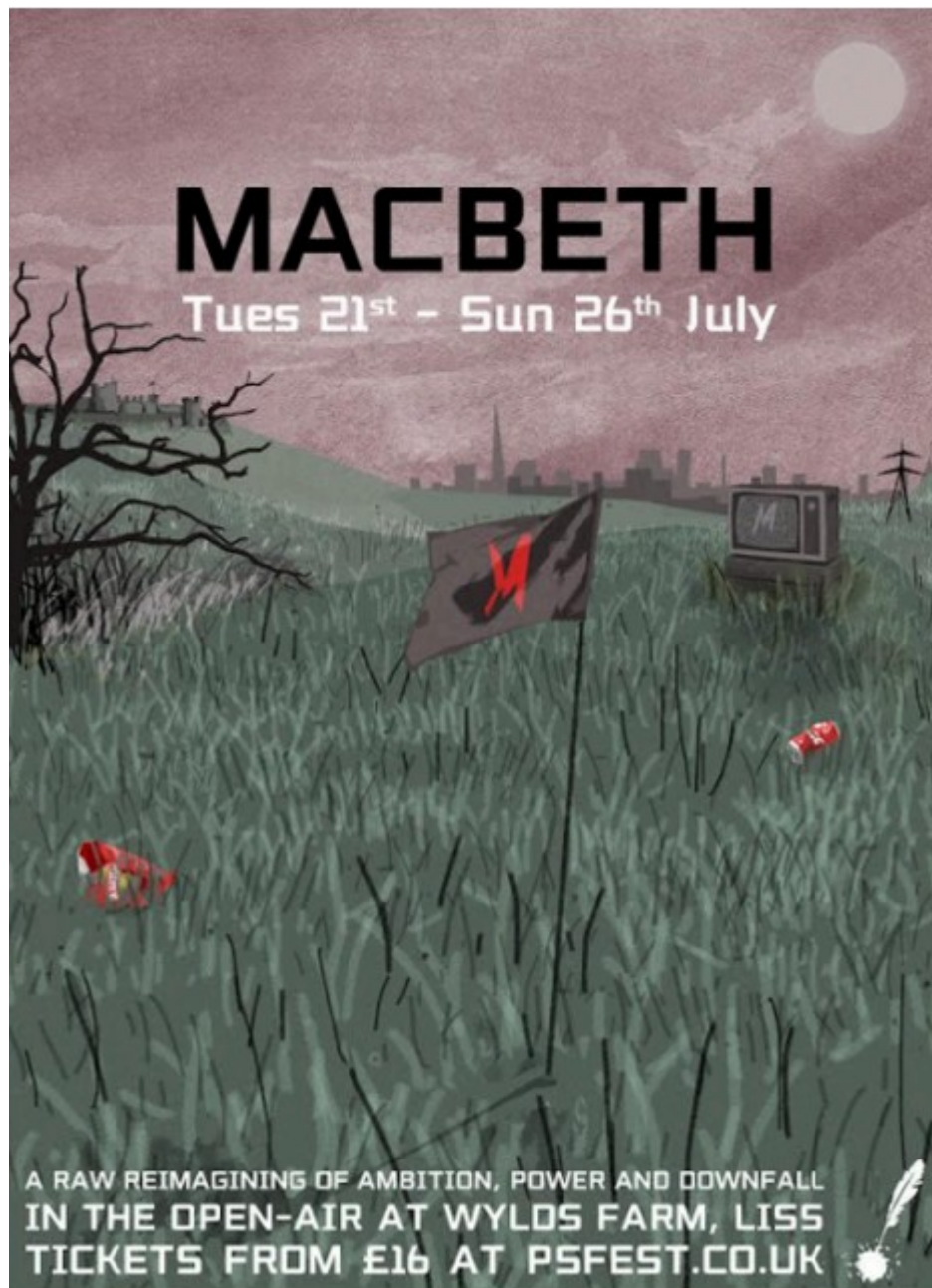
Subject	Estimated time per week

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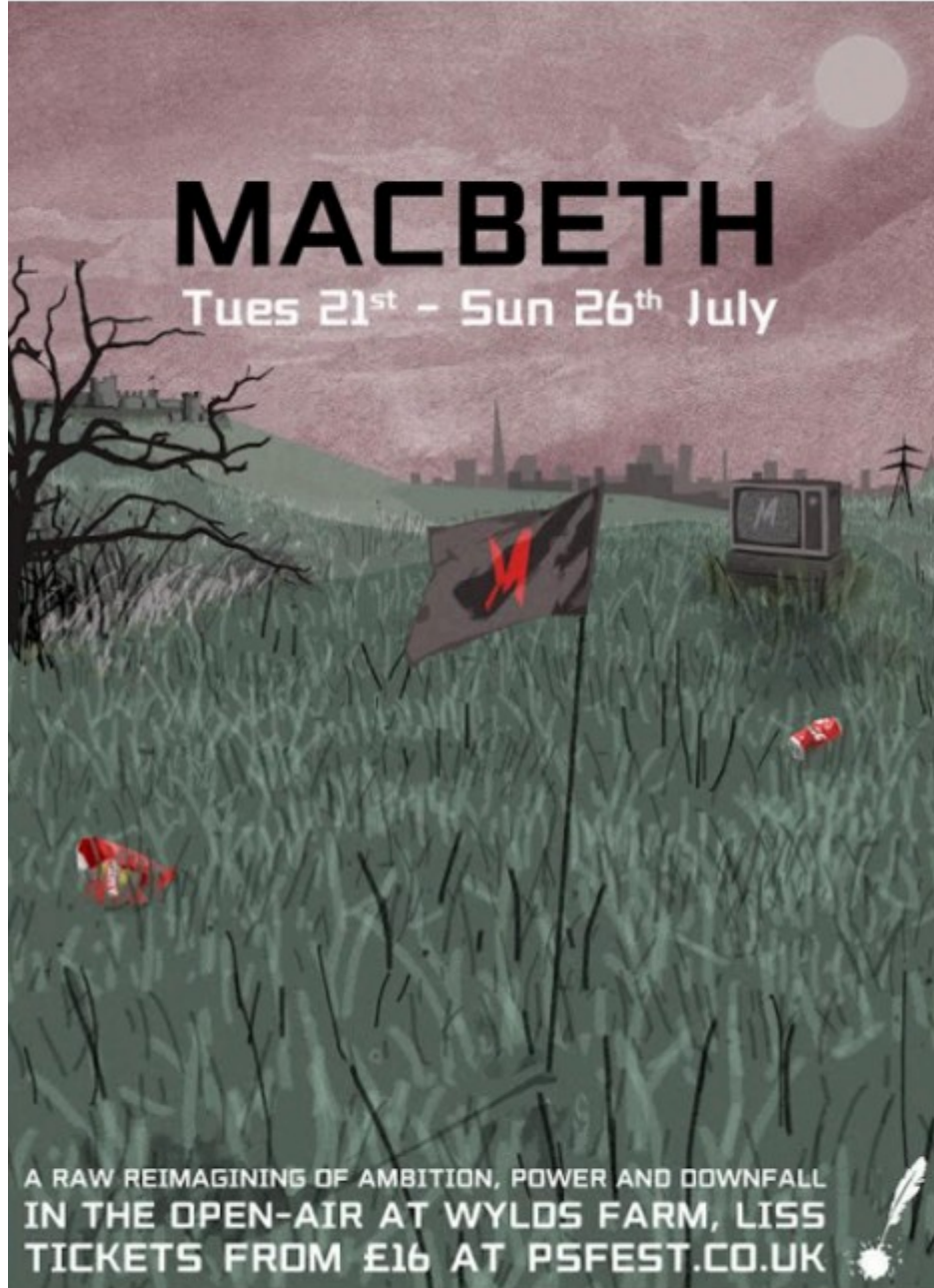

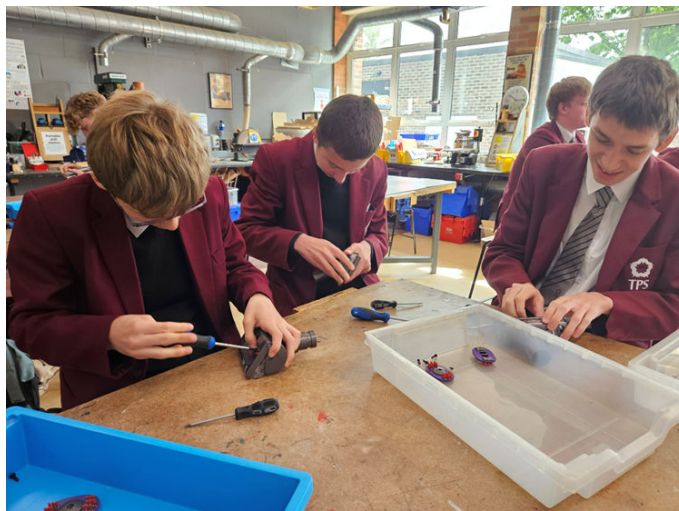

Design and Technology



This week in Design and Technology, Year 10 are exploring 'designer issues' and looking at why a designer would disassemble a product?

We were lucky to have resources supplied by Dyson for this engaging lesson. This allowed students to work hands on with real world products. We spent the first part of the lesson analysing a Dyson product and all students were able to give really good feedback on the design, it's function and how materials choice effect design ideas. They discussed how the customer would use it and identifying possibilities for future modifications, also thinking about sustainability and how electronic products effect the world we live in.

Then we got stuck in taking Dyson products apart to see if we could learn from them and develop the design idea further.

The biggest challenge came when we had to put the product back together again!

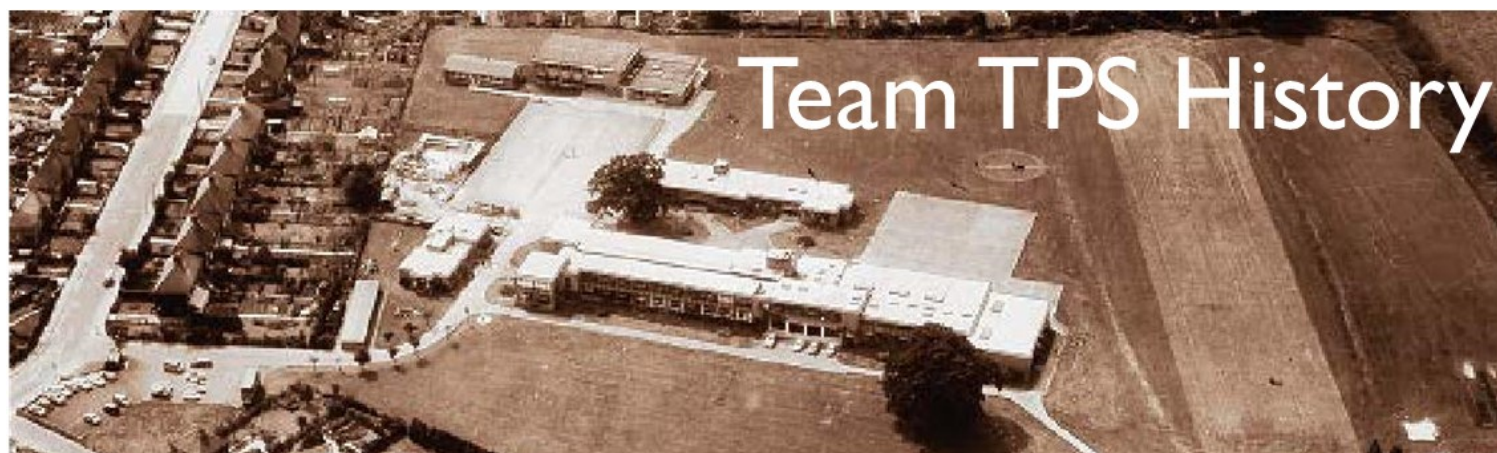
